A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO NURSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	ION 1. Chapter 457, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended b	y adding a new section to be appropriately designated
3	and to re	ad as follows:
4	" <u>§45</u>	7- Temporary permit. (a) The board may issue a
5	temporary	permit to a practical nurse or registered nurse
6	licensed	in another jurisdiction who:
7	(1)	Completes an application on a form prescribed by the
8		board;
9	(2)	Pays all fees as prescribed by administrative rules
10		that are made applicable to the board;
11	(3)	Provides proof of a valid and unencumbered license in
12		another state, territory, or country by way of a
13		license verification from the other state, territory,
14		or country, or Nursys license verification report
15		pursuant to applicable rule;
16	(4)	Completes the fingerprinting requirement for a federal
17		and state criminal record check; and

1	<u>(5)</u>	Submits a certified copy of the self-query report from
2		the National Practitioners Data Bank to the board.
3	(b)	The board may issue a temporary permit to an
4	individua	l who currently holds a multistate license issued by
5	another s	tate, provided that the individual:
6	(1)	Completes an application on a form prescribed by the
7		board;
8	(2)	Pays all fees as prescribed by administrative rules
9		that are made applicable to the board;
10	(3)	Provides proof of a valid and unencumbered multistate
11		license in another state, territory, or country by way
12		of a Nursys license verification report pursuant to
13		applicable rule. For purposes of this subsection, a
14		"multistate license" means a license to practice as a
15		licensed practical nurse or registered nurse issued by
16		a home state licensing board that authorizes the
17		licensed nurse to practice in all party states under a
18		multistate licensure privilege; and
19	(4)	Submits to the board a certified copy of the self-
20		query report from the National Practitioners Data
21		Bank.

1	(c) A temporary permit shall be issued only to an
2	applicant who has been appointed or accepted employment with a
3	single health care entity in the state listed in section 321-
4	11(10).
5	(d) A temporary permit shall be valid only for a period of
6	six months from the date of issuance. In no case shall a
7	temporary permit be valid for more than a period of six months
8	from the date of issuance. A new and separate temporary permit
9	may be issued; provided that the requirements of subsections (a)
10	or (b) have been satisfied as applicable."
11	SECTION 2. Section 457-7, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
12	amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:
13	"(b) Licenses shall be granted either by:
14	(1) Examination: The applicant shall be required to pass
15	a written examination in nursing subjects as
16	determined by the board. Upon the applicant's passage
17	of the examination and compliance with the applicable
18	requirements of this chapter and the rules of the
19	board, the board shall issue to the applicant a
20	license to practice nursing as a registered nurse; or

Ţ	(2)	Endorsement: The board may issue a license to
2		practice nursing as a registered nurse by endorsement
3		to an applicant who has been licensed as a registered
4		nurse under the laws of another state, territory, or
5		foreign country if the applicant has an unencumbered
6		license and, in the opinion of the board, the
7		applicant meets the qualifications required of
8		registered nurses in this State at the time of
9		graduation. [Pending verification of a valid,
10		unencumbered license from another state, territory, or
11		foreign country, a temporary permit may be issued for
12		employment with a Hawaii employer.]"
13	SECT	ION 3. Section 457-8, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
14	amended b	y amending subsection (b) to read as follows:
15	"(b)	Licenses shall be granted either by:
16	(1)	Examination: The applicant shall be required to pass
17		a written examination in nursing subjects as
18		determined by the board. Upon the applicant's passage
19		of the examination and compliance with the applicable
20		requirements of this chapter and the rules of the
21		board, the board shall issue to the applicant a

1		license to practice nursing as a licensed practical
2		nurse; or
3	(2)	Endorsement: The board may issue a license to
4		practice nursing as a licensed practical nurse by
5		endorsement to any applicant who has been licensed as
6		a licensed practical nurse, or a person entitled to
7		perform similar services under a different title,
8		under the laws of another state, territory, or foreign
9		country if the applicant has an unencumbered license
10		and, in the opinion of the board, the applicant meets
11		the requirements for licensed practical nurses in this
12		State at the time of graduation. [Pending
13		verification of a valid, unencumbered license from
14		another state, territory, or foreign country, a
15		temporary permit may be issued for employment with a
16		Hawaii employer.] "
17	SECT	ION 4. Section 457-13, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
18	amended t	o read as follows:
19	"§45	7-13 Exceptions. This chapter does not prohibit:
20	(1)	The furnishing of nursing assistance in an emergency;

1	(2)	The practice of nursing that is incidental to the
2		program of study engaged in by students enrolled in
3		nursing education programs accredited by the board;
4	[(3)	The practice of nursing under a nonrenewable permit
5		by:
6		(A) A graduate of; or
7		(B) An applicant who has provided proof that the
8		applicant has completed the entire educational
9		curriculum required for graduation for a nursing
10		license from
11		a school which is in or under the jurisdiction of the
12		United States, and whose accreditation is recognized
13		by the board; provided that following completion of
14		(A) or (B), the candidate takes the first licensing
15		examination scheduled by any board of nursing
16		recognized by the board and has submitted to the board
17		an application for a license to practice nursing in
18		this State; and provided further that the permit shall
19		be valid for three months or until the results of the
20		licensing examination are received by the board;

l	[(4)]	(3) The practice of any legally qualified nurse of
2		another state who is employed by the United States or
3		any bureau, division, or agency thereof, while in the
4		discharge of the nurse's official duties;
5	[(5)]	(4) The practice of nursing in connection with
6		healing by prayer or spiritual means alone in
7		accordance with the tenets and practice of any well
8		recognized church or religious denomination, provided
9		that no person practicing such nursing claims to
10		practice as a registered nurse or a licensed practical
11		nurse; [or]
12	[(6)]	(5) The administration of oral and topical medication
13		and in emergency situations, other premeasured
14		medication, by school health aides as provided in
15		section 302A-853[-]; or
16	(6)	The practice of nursing by a nurse licensed in another
17		state, territory, or country who is accompanying a
18		patient or patients from out of state for less than
19		two weeks and who is not employed by or affiliated
20		with a health care entity in the State."

1 SECTION 5. The department of commerce and consumer affairs 2 may adopt interim rules to establish fees for the administration 3 of this Act. All fees collected shall be deposited into the 4 credit of the compliance resolution fund established pursuant to section 26-9(o), Hawaii Revised Statutes. Fees assessed shall 5 6 be used to carry out the purposes of this Act without regard to 7 chapters 91 or 201M, Hawaii Revised Statutes; provided that: 8 The department shall hold at least one public hearing (1)9 prior to the adoption of interim rules; and 10 (2) The interim rules shall be effective for no more than 11 one year after their adoption. 12 SECTION 6. The department of commerce and consumer affairs 13 may employ necessary personnel without regard to chapter 76, 14 Hawaii Revised Statutes, including one full-time permanent 15 office assistant, for the purposes of this Act. 16 SECTION 7. There is appropriated out of the general **17** revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$78,426 or so much 18 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2023-2024 and the 19 same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 20 2024-2025 to be deposited into the compliance resolution fund.

Report Title:

Nurses; Registered Nurses; Practical Nurses; Board of Nursing; Licenses; Endorsement; Temporary Permits; Exceptions

Description:

Allows the Board of Nursing to issue temporary permits to registered nurses and practical nurses licensed in another jurisdiction under certain circumstances, and excepts from license requirements nurses who are licensed in another state, territory, or country accompanying a patient from out-of-state for a period of less than two weeks and not employed or affiliated with a health care facility in the State.

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
