BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

4	(c) A temporary permit shall only be issued to an
5	applicant who has been appointed or accepted employment with a
6	single health care entity listed in section 321-11(10).
7	(d) A temporary permit shall be issued within ten business
8	days of the date the completed application is received by the
9	board.
10	(e) A temporary permit shall be valid only for a period of
11	six months from the date of issuance. In no case shall a permit
12	issued hereunder be valid for more than a period of six months
13	from the date of issuance. A new and separate temporary permit
14	may be issued provided that the requirements of subsection (a)
15	or (b) have been satisfied."
16	SECTION 2. Section 457-7, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is

[Pending verification of a valid, 14 unencumbered license from another state, territory, or 15 foreign country, a temporary permit may be issued for 16 employment with a Hawaii employer.]" 17 SECTION 3. Section 457-8, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 18 amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows: 19 "(b) Licenses shall be granted either by: 20 (1) Examination: The applicant shall be required to pass 21 a written examination in nursing subjects as

determined by the board. Upon the applicant's passage of the examination and compliance with the applicable requirements of this chapter and the rules of the board, the board shall issue to the applicant a license to practice nursing as a licensed practical nurse; or

7 (2) Endorsement: The board may issue a license to 8 practice nursing as a licensed practical nurse by 9 endorsement to any applicant who has been licensed as 10 a licensed practical nurse, or a person entitled to 11 perform similar services under a different title, 12 under the laws of another state, territory, or foreign 13 country if the applicant has an unencumbered license 14 and, in the opinion of the board, the applicant meets 15 the requirements for licensed practical nurses in this 16 State at the time of graduation. [Pending 17 verification of a valid, unencumbered license from 18 another state, territory, or foreign country, a 19 temporary permit may be issued for employment with a 20 Hawaii employer.]"

4	SECTION 5. The department of commerce and consumer affairs
5	may adopt interim rules to establish fees for the administration
6	of this Act. All fees collected shall be deposited to the
7	credit of the compliance resolution fund established pursuant to
8	section 26-9(o), Hawaii Revised Statutes. Fees assessed shall
9	be used to carry out the purposes of this Act without regard to
10	chapter 91 or 201M, Hawaii Revised Statutes; provided that:
11	(1) The department shall hold at least one public hearing
12	prior to the adoption of interim rules; and
13	(2) The interim rules shall be effective for no more than
14	one year after their adoption.
15	SECTION 6. The department of commerce and consumer affairs
16	may employ necessary personnel without regard to chapter 76,
17	Hawaii Revised Statutes, including one full-time equivalent (1.0
18	FTE) permanent office assistant, for the purposes of this Act.
19	SECTION 7. There is appropriated out of the general
20	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
21	much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2023-2024 and

1 the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal 2 year 2024-2025 to be deposited into the compliance resolution 3 fund.

SECTION 8. There is appropriated out of the compliance
resolution fund the sum of \$ or so much thereof as may
be necessary for fiscal year 2023-2024 and the same sum or so
much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2024-2025 to
implement the regulation of nurses as required by this Act.

9 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
10 of commerce and consumer affairs for the purposes of this Act.
11 SECTION 9. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
12 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

13 SECTION 10. This Act shall take effect on June 30, 3000.

Nurses; Registered Nurses; Licensed Practical Nurses; Board of Nursing; Licenses; Endorsement; Temporary Permits; Exceptions; Appropriation

Description:

Authorizes the board of nursing to issue temporary permits for six-month periods to out-of-state licensed practical nurses and registered nurses or who hold a multistate license issued by another state, territory, or foreign country, under certain circumstances. Provides an exception from licensing requirements to nurses who are licensed in another state, territory, or foreign country and accompanying a patient from out-of-state for a period of less than two weeks and who are not employed or affiliated with a health care entity in the State. Appropriates funds. Effective 6/30/3000. (HD2)
