A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO COMMERCIAL ACTIVITIES ON BEACHES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 200, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
3 and to read as follows:

4 "§200- Prohibited commercial activities on beaches;
5 administrative fine. (a) No commercial vendor shall preset
6 commercial beach equipment on any public beach under the
7 jurisdiction of the department unless the customer is physically
8 present for the immediate use of the commercial beach equipment.
9 The commercial vendor shall expeditiously remove the commercial
10 beach equipment after the customer has finished using it.

11 (b) The department may authorize exemptions to subsection
12 (a) through rules adopted pursuant to chapter 91.

13 (c) This section shall apply only to public beaches and
14 not beaches located on private land, such as accreted lands.

15 (d) Any commercial vendor who violates subsection (a)
16 shall be subject to an administrative fine of not less than \$50
17 and not more than \$1,000 for each occurrence of a violation.

1 (e) As used in this section:

2 "Commercial beach equipment" means recreational equipment
3 for rent, including chairs, umbrellas, surfboards, paddleboards,
4 kayaks, and other non-motorized watercraft equipment.

5 "Preset" means to set up or physically ready for use
6 commercial beach equipment by a commercial vendor."

7 SECTION 2. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
8 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
9 begun before its effective date.

10 SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.

11 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

Report Title:

Department of Land and Natural Resources; Beaches; Commercial Beach Equipment; Presetting; Removal; Commercial Vendors

Description:

Prohibits any commercial vendor from presetting commercial beach equipment on any public beach under the jurisdiction of the Department of Land and Natural Resources, unless the customer is physically present. Requires commercial vendors to expeditiously remove commercial beach equipment after the customer has finished using it. Allows the Department of Land and Natural Resources to grant exemptions through rules. Establishes administrative fines for violations. Pertains only to public beaches and does not include private lands such as accreted lands.
