A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ANIMAL FUR PRODUCTS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that animals that are
- 2 slaughtered for their fur endure tremendous suffering. Animals
- 3 raised on fur farms typically spend their entire lives in
- 4 cramped and filthy cages. Fur farmers typically use the
- 5 cheapest killing methods available, including suffocation,
- 6 electrocution, gas, and poison.
- 7 The legislature recognizes that fur farms are reservoirs
- 8 and transmission vectors for dangerous zoonotic disease,
- 9 including SARS coronaviruses, that threaten public health.
- 10 Coronavirus disease 2019 infections have been confirmed at fur
- 11 farms in Europe and the United States, and scientific studies
- 12 have linked mink, raccoon dogs, and foxes, animals most commonly
- 13 farmed for fur, to a variety of coronaviruses.
- 14 The legislature further finds that the fur production
- 15 process is energy intensive and has a significant environmental
- 16 impact, including air and water pollution. Runoff from the fur
- 17 production process contains high concentrations of phosphorus



- 1 and nitrogen, which are among the most common forms of water
- 2 pollution in the United States.
- 3 Considering the wide array of alternatives for fashion and
- 4 apparel, the legislature finds that the demand for fur products
- 5 does not justify the unnecessary killing and cruel treatment of
- 6 animals, harm to the environment, and the public health risks
- 7 created by these practices.
- 8 The legislature believes that banning the sale of fur
- 9 products in the State will decrease the industry demand for
- 10 these cruel and environmentally harmful products and promote
- 11 community awareness of animal welfare and, in turn, will enhance
- 12 the reputation of the State.
- The purpose of this Act is to prohibit the trade of certain
- 14 animal fur products in the State.
- 15 SECTION 2. Chapter 183D, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 16 amended by adding a new section to part V to be appropriately
- 17 designated and to read as follows:
- 18 "§183D- Animal fur products. (a) It shall be unlawful
- 19 to sell, offer for sale, display for sale, trade, or otherwise
- 20 distribute for monetary or nonmonetary consideration a fur

2	fur produ	act shall be deemed to occur in Hawaii if:	
3	(1)	The buyer takes physical possession of the fur product	
4		in Hawaii; or	
5	(2)	The seller is located in Hawaii.	
6	<u>(b)</u>	This section shall not apply to the sale, offer for	
7	sale, display for sale, trade, or distribution of:		
8	(1)	A used fur product by a person (excluding a retail	
9		transaction), nonprofit organization, or second-hand	
10		store, including a pawn shop;	
11	(2)	A fur product used in the exercise of traditional and	
12		customary rights protected pursuant to article XII,	
13		section 7, of the Hawaii State Constitution; or	
14	(3)	A fur product where the activity is expressly	
15		authorized by federal law.	
16	<u>(c)</u>	A person in violation of this section shall be subject	
17	to a civi	l penalty not to exceed \$1,000. Each fur product sold,	
18	offered f	or sale, displayed for sale, traded, or distributed in	
19	violation	of this section, and every day upon which any	
20	violation	shall occur, shall constitute a separate offense.	

1	(d) The department may adopt rules pursuant to c	hapter	91
2	to further implement or enforce this section.		
3	(e) As used in this section:		
4	"Fur" means any animal skin with hair, fleece, or	fur	
5	fibers attached, either in its raw or processed state.		
6	"Fur product" means any article of clothing or co	vering	for
7	any part of the body, or any fashion accessory, includ	ing but	
8	not limited to handbags, shoes, slippers, hats, earmuf	fs,	
9	scarves, shawls, gloves, jewelry, keychains, toys or t	rinkets	
10	or home accessories and decor that is made in whole or	in par	<u>t</u>
11	of fur. "Fur product" does not include any of the fol	lowing:	
12	(1) An animal skin or part thereof that is to be	conver	ted
13	into leather, or which in processing will ha	ve the	
14	hair, fleece, or fur fiber completely remove	<u>d;</u>	
15	(2) Cowhide with the hair attached thereto;	1	
16	(3) Deerskin with the hair attached thereto;		
17	(4) Lambskin or sheepskin with the fleece attach	<u>ed</u>	
18	thereto; or		
19	(5) The pelt or skin of any animal that is prese	rved	
20	through taxidermy or for the purposes of tax	idermy.	_

- 1 "Nonprofit organization" means any entity exempt from
- 2 federal taxes under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue
- 3 Code of 1986, as amended, for charitable, religious,
- 4 philanthropic, educational, or similar purposes.
- 5 "Taxidermy" means the practice of preparing and preserving
- 6 the skin of an animal that is deceased and stuffing and mounting
- 7 it in lifelike form.
- 8 "Ultimate consumer" means a person who buys a fur product
- 9 for the person's own use, or for the use of another, but not for
- 10 resale or trade.
- "Used fur product" means a fur product that has been worn
- 12 or used by an ultimate consumer."
- 13 SECTION 3. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 14 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 15 done before its effective date.
- 16 SECTION 4. If any provision of this Act, or the
- 17 application thereof to any person or circumstance, is held
- 18 invalid, the invalidity does not affect other provisions or
- 19 applications of the Act that can be given effect without the
- 20 invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions
- 21 of this Act are severable.

- 1 SECTION 5. New statutory material is underscored.
- 2 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
