A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HAWAIIAN CULTURE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that native Hawaiian 2 culture is the foundation of all aspects of life in Hawaii. 3 This culture influences Hawaii's government, businesses, tourism 4 industry, families, and individuals. The legislature recognizes 5 that despite the prevalence of this cultural foundation, there 6 are no public spaces dedicated to the practice and perpetuation 7 of Hawaiian culture and believes that Native Hawaiian cultural 8 centers may serve as places where residents and visitors may 9 learn about Hawaiian culture, history, tradition, and practices. 10 The purpose of this Act is to require and appropriate funds 11 for the office of Hawaiian affairs to conduct a study to 12 determine the feasibility of establishing Native Hawaiian cultural centers within the State. 13

SECTION 2. (a) The office of Hawaiian affairs shall
conduct a study to determine the feasibility of establishing
Native Hawaiian cultural centers within the State that:

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(5) Potential permanent sources of funding for operation
 of the centers.

3 (c) No later than twenty days prior to the convening of 4 the regular session of 2024, the office of Hawaiian affairs 5 shall submit to the legislature a report of the findings of the 6 feasibility study to include, at minimum, the items listed in 7 subsection (b), along with the office of Hawaiian affairs' recommendation on whether it is feasible or advisable to 8 9 establish Native Hawaiian cultural centers and, if so, under 10 what conditions or parameters.

SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2023-2024 for the office of Hawaiian affairs to conduct a feasibility study pursuant to section 2 of this Act.

16 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the office of17 Hawaiian affairs for the purposes of this Act.

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SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on June 30, 3000.
