## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SEARCH AND RESCUE.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Hawaii is an outdoor
- 2 playground world-renowned for its beautiful hikes through lush
- 3 green forests and mountains. However, the coronavirus pandemic
- 4 fueled a sustained surge of experienced and inexperienced hikers
- 5 venturing outdoors. Occasionally, hikers ignore posted warning
- 6 signs, intentionally leave a hiking trail, or enter property
- 7 that is closed to the public. When one of these hikers needs to
- 8 be rescued, it is government entities that bear the costs
- 9 associated with the search or rescue.
- 10 The legislature further finds that in response to having to
- 11 pay the cost of rescuing recreational hikers who take
- 12 unnecessary risks, several states, including Idaho, Maine, New
- 13 Hampshire, Oregon, South Dakota, and Vermont, have passed
- 14 legislation that allows the state to offset the costs associated
- 15 with the search or rescue by seeking reimbursement from the
- 16 rescued party.



1	The purpose of this Act is to require government entities	
2	to seek reimbursement for all or a portion of search or rescue	
3	expenses for persons who require rescue after:	
4	(1) Leaving a hiking trail and entering state, county, or	
5	private property that is closed to the public and is	
6	marked with a sign giving notice of the closure; or	
7	(2) Entering a hiking trail that is closed to the public	
8	and marked with a sign giving notice of the closure.	
9	SECTION 2. Section 137-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is	
10	amended to read as follows:	
11	"[+]\$137-2[+] Reimbursement. (a) [Whenever] Subject to	
12	subsection (b), whenever any government entity engages in a	
13	search or rescue operation for the purpose of searching for or	
14	rescuing a person, and incurs search and rescue expenses	
15	therein, the government entity may seek reimbursement from the	
16	following:	
17	(1) The person on whose behalf search or rescue operations	
18	were conducted, including the person's estate,

	guardians, custodians, or other entity responsible for	

1	(2)	A person who ultimately benefited from a search or
2		rescue operation by being rescued; or
3	(3)	Any entity responsible for placing the person in the
4		position of danger for which the search or rescue
5		operation was initiated.
6	<del>(d)</del> ]	- Reimbursement under subsection (a) shall be allowed
7	only if t	he need for search or rescue was caused by any act or
8	<del>omission</del>	by the person searched for or rescued, constituting
9	intention	al disregard for the person's safety, including, but
10	not limit	ed to, intentionally disregarding a warning or notice.
11	(b)	A government entity shall seek reimbursement for all
12	or a port	ion, but no less than half, of search or rescue
13	expenses	from all applicable persons or entities pursuant to
14	subsectio	n (a) if the need for the search or rescue was the
15	result of	the person:
16	(1)	Leaving a hiking trail and entering state, county, or
17		private property that is closed to the public and is
18		marked with a sign giving notice of the closure; or
19	(2)	Entering a hiking trail that is closed to the public
20		and marked with a sign giving notice of the closure."

- 1 SECTION 3. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 2 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 3 begun before its effective date.
- 4 SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 5 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 6 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on June 30, 3000.

## Report Title:

Hiking Trails; Search and Rescue; Trespassing; Reimbursement; Signage

## Description:

Requires government entities to seek reimbursement for all or a portion of search or rescue expenses for persons who require rescue after leaving a hiking trail to enter an area closed to the public or hiking on a trail closed to the public, with a sign giving notice of the closure. Effective 6/30/3000. (HD1)
