#### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO AQUACULTURE.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	PART I
2	SECTION 1. Chapter 163D, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
3	amended by adding a new part to be appropriately designated and
4	to read as follows:
5	"PART . AQUACULTURE
6	<b>§163D-A Definitions.</b> As used in this part:
7	"Aquaculture" means any form of agriculture devoted to the
8	propagation, cultivation, maintenance, and harvesting of aquatic
9	plants and animals in marine, brackish, and fresh water. The
10	term "aquaculture" does not include species of ornamental marine
11	or freshwater plants and animals that are not utilized for human
12	consumption or bait purposes and that are maintained in closed
13	systems for personal, pet industry, or hobby purposes.
14	"Executive director" means the executive director appointed

15 pursuant to section 163D-3.

4	<b>§163D-B Aquaculture program.</b> (a) There is established		
5	within th	e corporation an aquaculture program that shall:

9		worthwhile aquaculture activities;	
10	(2)	Serve as an information clearinghouse for aquaculture	
11		activities;

14		raising selected species having commercial potential;	
15	(4)	Actively seek federal funding for aquaculture	
16		activities;	
17	(5)	Undertake activities required to develop and expand

1 §163D-E Powers, duties, and activities of the corporation. 2 (a) The business of aquaculture shall be governed by this part 3 and shall be exempt from any other provisions relating to the 4 harvesting, processing, and marketing of cultured aquatic life. 5 (b) Except as provided in this part, the business of 6 aquaculture processing, distribution, and marketing shall be 7 administered by the executive director. 8 The executive director may enter into an agreement (C) 9 with the chairperson of the board of land and natural resources, 10 the chairperson of the board of agriculture, or both for the 11 resolution of any conflict regarding jurisdiction that arises 12 under this part. 13 (d) Any costs incurred by the corporation in implementing 14 this part shall be recovered pursuant to this part. 15 "**§163D-F Rulemaking authority.** The corporation shall 16 adopt rules pursuant to chapter 91 to effectuate the purpose of 17 this part." 18 PART II 19 SECTION 2. Section 26-16, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 20 amended by amending subsection (c) to read as follows: 21 "(C) The department shall:

20	SECTION 7. Any unencumbered balance remaining in the
21	aquaculture development special fund repealed by section 5 of



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this Act shall be transferred to the credit of the aquaculture 1 2 development special fund established by section 1 of this Act. 3 SECTION 8. There is appropriated out of the general 4 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2023-2024 and the 5 same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 6 7 2024-2025 for the establishment of the Wilikina hatchery and 8 education center. 9 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the agribusiness 10 development corporation for the purposes of this Act. 11 SECTION 9. There is appropriated out of the general 12 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2023-2024 and 13 14 the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2024-2025 for the establishment of the Mokuleia aquaculture 15 16 innovation center. 17 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the agribusiness 18 development corporation for the purposes of this Act.

19 SECTION 10. All rights, powers, functions, and duties of20 the department of agriculture relating to the amendments made by



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part II of this Act are transferred to the agribusiness
development corporation.

3 All employees who occupy civil service positions and whose 4 functions are transferred to the agribusiness development 5 corporation by this Act shall retain their civil service status, 6 whether permanent or temporary. Employees shall be transferred 7 without loss of salary, seniority (except as prescribed by 8 applicable collective bargaining agreements), retention points, 9 prior service credit, any vacation and sick leave credits 10 previously earned, and other rights, benefits, and privileges, 11 in accordance with state personnel laws and this Act; provided 12 that the employees possess the minimum qualifications and public 13 employment requirements for the class or position to which 14 transferred or appointed, as applicable; provided further that 15 subsequent changes in status may be made pursuant to applicable 16 civil service and compensation laws.

Any employee who, prior to this Act, is exempt from civil service and is transferred as a consequence of this Act may retain the employee's exempt status, but shall not be appointed to a civil service position as a consequence of this Act. An exempt employee who is transferred by this Act shall not suffer



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1 any loss of prior service credit, vacation or sick leave credits previously earned, or other employee benefits or privileges as a 2 3 consequence of this Act; provided that the employees possess 4 legal and public employment requirements for the position to 5 which transferred or appointed, as applicable; provided further that subsequent changes in status may be made pursuant to 6 7 applicable employment and compensation laws. The executive 8 director of the agribusiness development corporation may 9 prescribe the duties and qualifications of these employees and 10 fix their salaries without regard to chapter 76, Hawaii Revised 11 Statutes.

SECTION 11. All appropriations, records, equipment, machines, files, supplies, contracts, books, papers, documents, maps, and other personal property heretofore made, used, acquired, or held by the department of agriculture relating to the functions transferred to the agribusiness development corporation shall be transferred with the functions to which they relate.

19 SECTION 12. In codifying the new sections added by20 section 1 of this Act, the revisor of statutes shall substitute



appropriate section numbers for the letters used in designating
the new sections in this Act.
SECTION 13. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
SECTION 14. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2023.
