A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EMERGENCY MEDICAL RESPONSE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that in critical medical
- 2 emergencies, each minute matters. Long-term injury, brain
- 3 damage, and even death can occur within just a few minutes in
- 4 some types of emergencies. Whether it is a student choking or a
- 5 teacher experiencing cardiac arrest, help provided within four
- 6 minutes, rather than eight minutes, can save a life.
- 7 The legislature further finds that while the department of
- 8 education currently has basic emergency response guidance, there
- 9 is a gap between the guidance provided to "administer first aid"
- 10 and the training and preparedness of personnel in the case of an
- 11 unforeseen critical medical emergency.
- Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to supplement the
- 13 department of education's emergency procedures guide, RS
- 14 10-0431, by requiring that each department school's
- 15 administration and public charter school's administration
- 16 appoint any member of the staff to be a critical emergency
- 17 response team member.



1	SECTION 2. Chapter 302A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding a new section to part III, subpart F, to be
3	appropriately designated and to read as follows:
4	"§302A- Critical emergency response. (a) Each
5	department school shall establish a critical emergency response
6	team that shall consist of critical emergency response team
7	members.
8	(b) Each critical emergency response team member shall:
9	(1) Maintain active certifications in first aid,
10	cardiopulmonary resuscitation, and automated external
11	defibrillator from organizations approved by the
12	department; provided that any certification more than
13	two years old shall not be valid for purposes of this
14	paragraph; and
15	(2) Respond in good faith when activated.
16	(c) For purposes of this section:
17	"Critical emergency" means a situation in which a person is
18	in immediate danger of loss of life, including from cardiac
19	arrest, choking, or uncontrolled bleeding.
20	"First aid" means lifesaving help given in a critical
21	emergency, including providing abdominal thrusts when someone is

1	choking,	performing cardiopulmonary resuscitation when someone	
2	is uncons	cious and does not have a pulse, or applying pressure	
3	or a tourniquet in an uncontrolled bleeding."		
4	SECTION 3. Chapter 302D, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
5	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated		
6	and to read as follows:		
7	" <u>§</u> 30	2D- Critical emergency response. (a) Each public	
8	charter s	chool shall establish a critical emergency response	
9	team that	shall consist of critical emergency response team	
10	members.		
11	(b)	Each critical emergency response team member shall:	
12	(1)	Maintain active certifications in first aid,	
13		cardiopulmonary resuscitation, and automated external	
14		defibrillator from organizations approved by the	
15		department; provided that any certification more than	
16		two years old shall not be valid for purposes of this	
17		paragraph; and	
18	(2)	Respond in good faith when activated.	
19	<u>(c)</u>	For purposes of this section:	

1 "Critical emergency" means a situation in which a person is 2 in immediate danger of loss of life, including from cardiac 3 arrest, choking, or uncontrolled bleeding. 4 "First aid" means lifesaving help given in a critical emergency, including providing abdominal thrusts when someone is 5 6 choking, performing cardiopulmonary resuscitation when someone is unconscious and does not have a pulse, or applying pressure 7 8 or a tourniquet in an uncontrolled bleeding." 9 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general 10 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so 11 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2023-2024 and 12 the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal 13 year 2024-2025 for department schools to implement critical 14 emergency response teams. 15 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department 16 of education for the purposes of this Act. 17 SECTION 5. There is appropriated out of the general 18 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$

much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2023-2024 and

the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal

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- 1 year 2024-2025 for public charter schools to implement critical
- 2 emergency response teams.
- 3 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the state public
- 4 charter school commission for the purposes of this Act.
- 5 SECTION 6. New statutory material is underscored.
- 6 SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect on June 30, 3000.
