A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SPECIAL NUMBER PLATES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Keawalau o Puuloa, 2 also known as Puuloa or Pearl Harbor, is a place of cultural 3 significance and now exemplifies the power of positive, 4 community-led change and was first settled around 400 A.D. The Maweke family, one of the original families who settled in the 5 6 area, is credited with bringing sweet potato from Peru to Ewa 7 and dredging an entrance to allow large voyaging canoes to pass 8 over the shallow entrance to Puuloa. Puuloa's ancient 9 settlements near present-day Honouliuli, also known as West 10 Loch, represent the first and oldest settlements on the island 11 of Oahu. The area near Puuloa also served as a major political 12 capital in Ewa that governed the island of Oahu.

13 The legislature also finds that Puuloa was an abundant 14 water resource that contained at least thirty loko ia, 15 traditional Hawaiian fishponds, and loi kalo, patches of land 16 for taro cultivation. A convergence of estuaries, perennial 17 freshwater springs, shallow aquifers, and healthy nutrient

1 runoff provided loko ia and loi kalo with regenerative resources 2 needed to feed surrounding settlements. However, Puuloa's 3 aquatic resources have been exposed and contaminated with mercury, polychlorinated biphenyls, dioxins, pesticides, 4 5 microplastics, lead, and other harmful chemicals and materials 6 from multiple polluted runoff sources. Many toxins present in 7 Puuloa persist in the environment for significant periods of 8 time and bioaccumulate in the tissues of fish, aquatic plants, 9 and wildlife that live in the local ecosystems.

10 The legislature further finds that Malama Puuloa is a 11 501(c)3 nonprofit organization established in 2015 with a 12 mission to restore Puuloa to abundance. Through a community-13 driven approach that includes workdays, education, partnerships 14 with the community, and land-based programs, Malama Puuloa 15 focuses on rebuilding relationships between people and the land 16 to heal impacted waters and land. Since its inception, Malama 17 Puuloa hosted over ten thousand community and school volunteers to restore Puuloa's natural resources. It is therefore 18 appropriate that Malama Puuloa be honored with a special license 19 20 plate to further promote the organization's legacy of natural 21 resource management, perpetuation of Native Hawaiian culture,

and environmentalism through community-based volunteer programs
 and education.

Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to authorize the
issuance of special number plates to recognize and honor Malama
Puuloa.

6 SECTION 2. Chapter 249, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
7 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
8 and to read as follows:

9	" <u>§249-</u> Special number plates for Malama Puuloa
10	authorized. (a) Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, the
11	director of finance shall issue to any registered owner of a
12	motor vehicle, who is a resident of the State and has completed
13	the application and paid the required fees, a special number
14	plate for the registered owner's motor vehicle that commemorates
15	Malama Puuloa and observes the organization's contributions to
16	the restoration of Puuloa, also known as Pearl Harbor.
17	(b) The director of finance of the city and county of
18	Honolulu, in consultation with the directors of finance of the
19	counties of Kauai, Maui, and Hawaii; the chiefs of police of the
20	city and county of Honolulu and the counties of Kauai, Maui, and

10	<u>(e)</u>	The director of finance shall charge a special number
11	plate fee	at least equal to the county's cost of providing the
12	<u>special n</u>	umber plate and administrative costs, if any, plus a
13	fundraisi	ng fee to be determined by the director of finance in
14	consultat	ion with the executive director of Malama Puuloa. The
15	fundraisi	ng fee shall be in addition to any other state or
16	<u>county</u> fe	es collected for a motor vehicle registration or
17	<u>license p</u>	late.
18	<u>(f</u>)	The director of finance may charge an additional

1	fee is implemented pursuant to this subsection, the director of
2	finance shall not renew and instead shall revoke the special
3	number plate of the registered owner of a motor vehicle who
4	fails to pay the additional fundraising fee imposed by this
5	subsection.
6	(g) The revenue generated by the fundraising fees, or a
7	portion of the revenue generated by the fundraising fees as
8	determined by the director of finance, shall be deposited in the
9	name of Malama Puuloa in a separate county budget account. The
10	director of finance shall determine the most efficient means of
11	directing the net revenue generated by the fundraising fees to
12	Malama Puuloa, as appropriate, to fund the restoration of
13	Puuloa, or Pearl Harbor.
14	(h) The director of finance may revoke all special number
15	plates issued pursuant to this section if the total number of
16	registered owners of motor vehicles who obtain the special
17	number plates is less than one hundred fifty within three years
18	of issuance of the first special number plate.
19	(i) Nothing in this section shall be construed to apply to
20	any plates issued pursuant to section 249-9.2.
