A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE HAWAII STATE HEALTH INSURANCE ASSISTANCE PROGRAM.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that medicare is 2 essential to providing health care coverage for older adults and persons with disabilities in the State. However, the rules and 3 procedures for medicare eligibility and enrollment are complex 4 and difficult to navigate, especially for kupuna. 5 The legislature further finds that Hawaii's medicare population has 6 7 increased one hundred twenty per cent over the span of thirty 8 years, from 133,439 persons in 1992 to 295,405 in 2022. 9 According to World Population Review, an independent 10 organization without political affiliations, Hawaii ranks first 11 in the nation in terms of longevity, with residents living 81.3 12 years on average, and the cost of living is almost double that 13 of the national average, at 193.3 per cent. In 2022, total 14 medical and prescription drug spending rose to \$157,480,248. 15 According to a Financial Health Network and Hawaii Community 16 Foundation report, seventy-three per cent of beneficiaries

1 report dipping into savings and forty-seven per cent report 2 relying on family and friends for financial support. Approximately four per cent of the State is uninsured, and about 3 eleven per cent lives in poverty. Without insurance, unexpected 4 5 medical costs or a catastrophic illness could result in the loss 6 of one's home and assets. A lack of health care coverage will 7 lower health outcomes and increase health care costs, poverty 8 rates, and the number of individuals who qualify for the already 9 overburdened medicaid program.

10 The legislature further finds that Hawaii's state health 11 insurance assistance program was established within the 12 executive office on aging in 1992 with two temporary staff 13 members. The program's purpose is to assist and educate 14 medicare beneficiaries to:

- 15 (1) Make informed health insurance choices based on the16 beneficiary's needs and budget;
- 17 (2) Enroll in medicare as soon as first eligible to avoid
 18 lifetime late enrollment penalties;
- 19 (3) Access wellness and preventive services to improve
 20 health outcomes, lower health care costs, and promote
 21 aging in place; and

Enroll in low-income subsidy programs, such as 1 (4) 2 medicaid, to reduce out-of-pocket costs. Hawaii's state health insurance assistance program collaborates 3 with county agencies on aging to conduct statewide outreach at 4 health fairs, enrollment events, senior centers, and community 5 organizations and through presentations to employers to promote 6 7 the program's free, local, unbiased, and confidential services. 8 Hawaii's state health insurance assistance program currently serves over eight thousand eight hundred individuals, 9 10 approximately three per cent of Hawaii's medicare population. The Administration for Community Living considers eight per cent 11 12 of the medicare population, or 23,191 individuals, as acceptable performance and justification for continued funding. Additional 13 staffing resources are needed to meet this annual goal by fiscal 14 15 year 2025. 16 The purpose of this Act is to appropriate funds to Hawaii's 17 state health insurance assistance program for three program

18 specialist positions within the executive office on aging to 19 meet the growing aging population's increasing demand for 20 accurate, timely, and reliable services.

1 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general 2 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so 3 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2023-2024 and 4 the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal 5 year 2024-2025 for one full-time equivalent (1.0 FTE) program 6 specialist III position, one full-time equivalent (1.0 FTE) 7 program specialist IV position, and one full-time equivalent 8 (1.0 FTE) program specialist V position within the executive 9 office on aging for Hawaii's state health insurance assistance 10 program. 11 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the executive 12 office on aging for the purposes of this Act.

13 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on December 31,14 2050.
