A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE UNIFORM PARENTAGE ACT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	ION 1. (a) The department of the attorney general
2	shall con	vene a task force to recommend amendments to the Hawaii
3	Revised S	tatutes to update existing parentage laws that reflect
4	outdated	concepts of families, parenthood, conception and
5	gestation	, and parental rights.
6	(b)	The task force shall include the following members:
7	(1)	A representative from the department of the attorney
8		general, who shall serve as chairperson;
9	(2)	The director of health, or the director's designee;
10	(3)	A member of the Hawaii state commission on the status
11		of women;
12	(4)	A member of the Hawaii state commission on fatherhood;
13	(5)	A family court judge;
14	(6)	A family law attorney;
15	(7)	A health care professional familiar with hospital and
16		birthing center procedure experience;
17	(8)	A mental health professional familiar with post-
18		adoption experience;

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1	(9)	An individual with personal knowledge of adoption-
2		related health and medical issues;
3	(10)	An individual with personal knowledge of surrogacy;
4		and
5	(11)	Any other member as recommended by the task force.
6	(c)	The task force shall submit:
7	(1)	An interim report of its findings and recommendations,
8		including any proposed legislation, to the legislature
9		no later than twenty days prior to the convening of
10		the regular session of 2024; and
11	(2)	A final report of its findings and recommendations,
12		including any proposed legislation, no later than
13		forty days prior to the convening of the regular
14		session of 2025.
15	(d)	The task force shall be dissolved on December 31,
16	2025.	

SECTION 2. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

Uniform Parentage Act; Attorney General; Task Force; Report

Description:

Requires the Department of the Attorney General to convene a task force to recommend amendments to update existing parentage laws that reflect outdated concepts of families, parenthood, conception and gestation, and parental rights. Requires an interim and final report to the Legislature. (CD1)

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
