A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TRANSPORTATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that many major vehicle
- 2 manufacturers are planning to phase out the sale of new fossil
- 3 fuel vehicles by 2035. The largest vehicle markets in
- 4 California, New York, Europe, and other areas have already
- 5 prohibited the sale of fossil fuel vehicles beyond 2035.
- 6 However, rental fleets in Hawaii will be unable to adapt unless
- 7 sufficient electric vehicle charging infrastructure is available
- 8 at rental hubs, including airports, and destinations, including
- 9 hotels and visitor attractions.
- 10 The legislature further finds that due to their size,
- 11 public vehicle fleets and rental motor vehicle fleets are
- 12 responsible for the largest sources of vehicle pollution in the
- 13 State. In an effort to address this issue, the legislature
- 14 enacted Act 74, Session Laws of Hawaii 2021, to require all
- 15 state-owned, light-duty motor vehicles to be zero-emission
- 16 vehicles by the end of 2035. The legislature recognizes that
- 17 transitioning rental motor vehicle fleets to zero-emission



- 1 vehicles will reduce carbon emissions and increase the number of
- 2 zero-emissions vehicles entering the secondary market, making
- 3 clean electric vehicles more affordable and lowering the cost of
- 4 transportation for local residents.
- 5 Finally, the legislature finds that transitioning to
- $\mathbf{6}$ zero-emission rental fleets will demonstrate to visitors that
- 7 Hawaii is keeping pace with the innovation and electrification
- 8 of transportation of cities across Asia, Europe, and the United
- 9 States.
- 10 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to:
- 11 (1) Require rental car companies using state facilities to
- 12 pay or reimburse the State to construct new or use
- existing state electric vehicle charging
- infrastructure at those facilities beginning
- 15 January 1, 2028; and
- 16 (2) Establish a task force to determine the implementation
- of electric vehicle charging infrastructure to support
- one hundred per cent electric vehicle rental car
- fleets in the State by 2035.

1	SECTION 2. Chapter 437D, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
2	amended b	y adding a new section to be appropriately designated	
3	and to read as follows:		
4	" <u>§43</u>	7D- Electric vehicle charging stations; payment	
5	required.	Beginning January 1, 2028, all rental car companies	
6	using sta	te facilities shall pay for or reimburse the State to:	
7	(1)	Construct electric vehicle charging stations at those	
8		facilities; or	
9	(2)	Use existing state electric vehicle charging	
10		infrastructure at those facilities."	
11	SECTION 3. (a) There is established a task force to		
12	develop a	plan to implement electric vehicle charging	
13	infrastructure to support one hundred per cent electric vehicle		
14	rental fleets by 2035.		
15	(b)	The task force shall consist of the following members:	
16	(1)	The director of transportation, or the director's	
17		designee, who shall serve as chairperson;	
18	(2)	The director of the office of planning and sustainable	
19		development, or the director's designee,	
20	(3)	The chief energy officer of the Hawaii state energy	
21		office, or the chief energy officer's designee;	

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1	(4)	The chairperson of the senate standing committee with
2		primary purview over transportation, or the
3		chairperson's designee;
4	(5)	The chairperson of the house of representatives
5	·	standing committee with primary purview over
6		transportation, or the chairperson's designee;
7	(6)	A representative from the rental car industry, to be
8		appointed by the president of the senate;
9	(7)	A representative from the hotel industry, to be
10	•	appointed by the speaker of the house of
11		representatives;
12	(8)	A representative from the Hawaiian Electric Company;
13		and
14	(9)	Other stakeholders invited by the chairperson of the
15		task force.
16	(c)	The task force shall develop a plan to implement
17	electric	vehicle charging infrastructure to support one hundred
18	per cent	electric vehicle fleets in the State by 2035.
19	(d)	The task force shall submit annual reports of its
20	findings	and recommendations, including any proposed
21	legislat	ion, to the legislature no later than twenty days prior

- 1 to the convening of each regular session beginning with the
- 2 regular session of 2024; provided that the task force shall
- 3 submit its final annual report to the legislature no later than
- 4 twenty days prior to the convening of the regular session of
- **5** 2028.
- **6** (e) The task force shall cease to exist on December 30,
- **7** 2027.
- 8 SECTION 4. New statutory material is underscored.
- 9 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on June 30, 3000.

Description:

Requires rental vehicle companies using state facilities to pay or reimburse the State to construct new or use existing state electric vehicle charging infrastructure at those facilities, beginning January 1, 2028. Establishes a task force to develop a plan to implement electric vehicle charging infrastructure to support one hundred per cent electric vehicle rental car fleets in the State by 2035. Requires annual reports to the Legislature until the task force ends. Effective 6/30/3000. (HD1)
