SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF BUSINESS, ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT, AND TOURISM AND THE DEPARTMENT OF LABOR AND INDUSTRIAL RELATIONS TO CO-CONVENE A WORKING GROUP TO DEVELOP A COMPREHENSIVE PLAN FOR WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT WITH A FOCUS ON THE PRIORITY ECONOMIC CLUSTERS ESTABLISHED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF BUSINESS, ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT, AND TOURISM, TO MEET THE NEEDS OF THE STATE'S NEW ECONOMY.

WHEREAS, the coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19) and the 1 resulting lockdown created structural changes to the State's 2 economy and labor force; and 3 4 WHEREAS, COVID-19 and the resulting economic conditions 5 have given rise to workforce trends such as "the Great 6 Resignation", "the Great Reshuffle", and "the Great Re-Think" 7 which has motivated businesses to automate and find alternative 8 solutions for driving business productivity; and 9 10 WHEREAS, the Internet, the acceleration and proliferation 11 of automation, and the digitization of business practices, along 12 with the advancements in sensor technology, edge analytics, 13 machine learning, and artificial intelligence, have globally 14 given rise to the fourth Industrial Revolution, coined "Industry 15 4.0"; and 16 17 WHEREAS, the Department of Business, Economic Development, 18 and Tourism is developing a cluster-based economic development 19 and diversification plan, with priority economic clusters 20 aligned with the federal Comprehensive Economic Development 21 Strategies and local and state priorities and aggregated into a 22 23 statewide strategy; and 24 WHEREAS, the Department of Labor and Industrial Relations 25 administers programs that support the State's students and 26



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workers seeking employment, training, reemployment, and improved 1 employment opportunities; now, therefore, 2 3 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-second 4 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2023, the 5 House of Representatives concurring, that the Department of 6 Business, Economic Development, and Tourism and the Department 7 of Labor and Industrial Relations are requested to co-convene a 8 9 working group to develop a comprehensive plan for workforce development with a focus on the priority economic clusters 10 established by the Department of Business, Economic Development, 11 and Tourism, to meet the needs of the State's new economy; and 12 13 14 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the membership of the working group is requested to consist of: 15 16 17 (1)A member of the House of Representatives, to be appointed by the Speaker of the House of 18 19 Representatives; 20 A member of the Senate, to be appointed by the Senate (2) 21 22 President; 23 24 (3) The Director of Business, Economic Development, and Tourism, and Director of Labor and Industrial 25 Relations, or their designees, who are requested to 26 serve as co-chairs; 27 28 (4) Private sector representatives to be invited by the 29 30 co-chairs; 31 (5) A representative from the Shidler College of Business 32 at the University of Hawaii at Manoa, to be appointed 33 34 by the President of the University of Hawaii; 35 The Superintendent of Education; (6) 36 37 A member from the Office of Economic Revitalization of 38 (7) the City and County of Honolulu, to be appointed by 39 **40** the Mayor of the City and County of Honolulu; 41



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- A member from the County of Hawaii's Department of 1 (8) Research and Development, to be appointed by the Mayor 2 3 of the County of Hawaii; 4 (9) A member from the County of Kauai's Office of Economic 5 Development, to be appointed by the Mayor of the 6 County of Kauai; and 7 8 A member from the County of Maui's Office of Economic 9 (10) Development, to be appointed by the Mayor of the 10 County of Maui; and 11 12 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the working group is requested 13 14 to produce a report that: 15 Provides data on the priority clusters identified for (1)16 economic diversification of the State's new economy; 17 18 (2) Identifies the industries in the priority economic 19 clusters; in-demand occupations; type of work that 20 comprise the occupations; forecast of industry growth 21 by jobs or sales; and training programs and funding 22 sources by status of employment and work; and 23 24 25 (3) Recommends structure and functions of partnerships with private sector industries to provide pre-26 employment or employment training, or on-the-job 27 training for employees and prospective employees; and 28 29 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Business, 30 Economic Development, and Tourism is requested to use the report 31 when updating section 371-17, Hawaii Revised Statutes, to codify 32 any viable processes of future planning and implementation of 33 34 collaborative, cluster economic development; and 35 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the working group is requested 36 37 to submit the report and any findings and recommendations, including any proposed legislation, to the Legislature no later 38 39 than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session 40 of 2024; and 41
