## SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE JUDICIARY, OFFICE OF THE PUBLIC DEFENDER, AND PROSECUTING ATTORNEY OF THE CITY AND COUNTY OF HONOLULU TO ESTABLISH A PERMANENT COMMUNITY OUTREACH MOBILE COURT AND TO EXPAND ITS SERVICE TO ALL NON-VIOLENT HOMELESS INDIVIDUALS BY WORKING TOGETHER WITH COMMUNITY PROVIDERS AND SUBMIT THE PROTOCOL AND BUDGET FOR EFFECTIVE OPERATIONS.

WHEREAS, Act 55, Session Laws of Hawaii 2017 (Act 55), established the Community Court Outreach Project in the City and County of Honolulu to offer combined accountability and treatment options to offenders to reduce crime and recidivism and help nonviolent offenders who face problems such as drug abuse and mental health challenges to obtain basic services and necessities, like food and shelter; and

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9 WHEREAS, the purpose and goal of Act 55 was to address the 10 issues facing homeless individuals who have contact with the 11 criminal justice system; and

WHEREAS, the stated purpose of the Community Court Outreach Project is to operate a mobile court that travels to communities where defendants have been cited or arrested for certain nonviolent offenses and do not pose a threat to the public and dispose of the cases for defendants who enter plea agreements after negotiations between the Prosecuting Attorney and Public Defender; and

21 WHEREAS, as of February 2023, since the Community Court 22 Outreach Project's inception, four hundred seventy people have 23 participated in the program, 7,663 cases have been cleared, and 24 5,645 community service hours have been completed; and 25

26 WHEREAS, the Judiciary administers and operates the
27 Community Court Outreach Project and the Prosecuting Attorney
28 and Public Defender participate in the project; and



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1 2 WHEREAS, the Community Court Outreach Project has been successful in addressing nonfelony offenses for nonviolent 3 offenders by recalling outstanding bench warrants and converting 4 5 monetary fines to community service work hours in order to help clear the offenders' criminal or traffic matters; and 6 7 8 WHEREAS, the Community Court Outreach Project is uniquely positioned to not only resolve participants' pending criminal 9 10 and traffic cases but also to address the personal and socioeconomic conditions that may be the root cause of 11 12 participants' involvement with the courts; and 13 14 WHEREAS, unless these root causes are addressed, 15 participants may not be able to break free of the cycle of 16 homelessness or contact with the criminal justice system; and 17 18 WHEREAS, in order to break this cycle, it is critical that 19 participants' individual needs be identified and assessed so that they may be referred to and connected with appropriate 20 21 social service providers who are willing and able to assist them in addressing those needs; and 22 23 24 WHEREAS, the Legislature has provided and continues to provide funding for social service providers, including the 25 Department of Human Services, Department of Health, Institute 26 27 for Human Services, and Hawaii Health and Harm Reduction Center, some of which already have connections with the Community Court 28 29 Outreach Project; and 30 31 WHEREAS, this body intends for these identified social 32 service providers, as well as others, to coordinate efforts with the Community Court Outreach Project to provide needed services 33 34 to the affected individuals who have contact with the Community 35 Court Outreach Project; and 36 37 WHEREAS, while the Community Court Outreach Project has 38 been successful, in order to reach its full potential, there 39 must be coordinated efforts to reach agreements and understandings, which may be memorialized through memoranda of 40 41 agreement or understanding between the Judiciary, Prosecuting
