SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE TO EXAMINE ORGANIC PESTICIDES FOR AUTHORIZED USE IN THE STATE.

1 2 3 4	WHEREAS, in recent years, organic pesticides have emerged as a popular alternative to conventional synthetic pesticides; and
5 6 7 8	WHEREAS, organic pesticides usually come from natural sources, such as plants, minerals, or microorganisms, and are minimally processed; and
9 10 11 12 13	WHEREAS, many farmers prefer organic pesticides over synthetic alternatives because organic pesticides typically break down faster in the environment, leaving no residual activity after a relatively short time; and
14 15 16 17	WHEREAS, organic pesticides, particularly biological insecticides, can also be selective in the types of pests controlled, which reduces potential harm to non-target species such as pollinators and other beneficial insects; and
18 19 20 21 22	WHEREAS, Hawaii has been impacted by various agricultural diseases and invasive species that threaten the State's agricultural industries; and
22 23 24 25 26	WHEREAS, identifying organic pesticides that can bolster Hawaii's agricultural sustainability while minimizing lasting environmental effects is a worthwhile endeavor; and
27 28 29 30 31	WHEREAS, currently, pesticide manufacturers, and other authorized individuals, must submit an application to the Department of Agriculture to license pesticides for use in the State; and

1	WHEREAS, the Department of Agriculture should be more
2	proactive in finding safe, organic pesticides for Hawaii's local
3	farmers; now, therefore,
4	
5	BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-second
6	Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2023, the
7	House of Representatives concurring, that the Department of
8	Agriculture is requested to:
9	
10	Study organic pesticides that are currently licensed
11	or authorized for use in the State; and
12	
13	(2) Find organic pesticides that are not currently
14	licensed or authorized for use, or otherwise
15	prohibited, in the State, and test those organic
16	pesticides for authorized use in the State; and
17	
18	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Agriculture
19	is requested to submit a report of its findings and
20	recommendations regarding organic pesticides, including any
21	proposed legislation, to the Legislature no later than twenty
22	days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2024; and
23	
24	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a certified copy of this
25	Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Chairperson of the
26	Board of Agriculture.
