SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION TO CONVENE A WORKING GROUP TO DEVELOP A WRITTEN PLAN FOR EVERY PUBLIC SCHOOL ELEMENTARY, MIDDLE, AND HIGH SCHOOL TO PROVIDE A UNIT OF INSTRUCTION IN ASIAN AMERICAN AND PACIFIC ISLANDER HISTORY AS PART OF THEIR REQUIRED CURRICULUM, COMMENCING WITH THE 2024-2025 SCHOOL YEAR.

WHEREAS, because of the coronavirus disease 2019 pandemic,
 there has been a sharp increase in discrimination against Asians
 in the United States; and

5 WHEREAS, there is also an increased awareness of the issues 6 that Pacific Islander Americans, especially migrants from 7 Compacts of Free Association (COFA) nations, continue to face, 8 especially the lack of access to health care; and 9

WHEREAS, the State's current K-12 school curriculum fails 10 to adequately teach Asian American and Pacific Islander history, 11 particularly regarding the impact of historical discrimination 12 of the United States against Asians and Pacific Islanders, such 13 as the 1882 Chinese Exclusion Act, the internment of Japanese-14 Americans during World War II, and the displacement of and 15 detrimental health impacts to Pacific Islanders that resulted 16 from the nuclear testing, mining, and establishment of United 17 States military-industrial complexes across the Melanesian, 18 Micronesian, and Polynesian islands; and 19

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WHEREAS, oftentimes, Asian Americans are held as the "model
 minority", a mythos that only serves to justify discriminatory
 practices against other minorities and ignores the countless
 sacrifices of early Asian immigrants; and

26 WHEREAS, there is widespread negative public perception of
27 Pacific Islander Americans in the State, especially COFA
28 migrants as they are wrongfully perceived as a drain on



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resources and continue to face discrimination in access to 1 2 housing, education, and employment; and 3 WHEREAS, teaching students about the contributions of Asian 4 American and Pacific Islander communities to the economic, 5 6 cultural, social, and political development of the United States could be greatly beneficial and would allow students to feel 7 empowered and to understand their ethnic identities as well as 8 their personal civic duty; now, therefore, 9 10 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-second 11 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2023, the 12 House of Representatives concurring, that the Department of 13 Education is requested to convene a working group to develop a 14 written plan for every public elementary, middle, and high 15 school to provide a unit of instruction in Asian American and 16 17 Pacific Islander history as part of each school's required 18 curriculum, commencing with the 2024-2025 school year; and 19 20 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the working group is requested to consist of members invited by the Superintendent of 21 Education: and 22 23 24 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the plan developed by the 25 working group is requested to include how: 26 27 (1)The Board of Education will incorporate in its 28 curriculum a unit of instruction on the events of 29 Asian American and Pacific Islander history, including the history of Asian Americans and Pacific Islanders 30 31 in Hawaii, contributions of Asian Americans and Pacific Islanders toward advancing civil rights from 32 the 19th century onward, and contributions of the 33 Asian American and Pacific Islander communities to the 34 cultural, economic, political, and social development 35 36 of the United States; and 37 (2) The Superintendent of Education will prepare and make 38 available to all school complex areas instructional 39 material, including but not limited to instructional 40 material established by non-governmental sources that 41 42 shall be the guidelines for development of the Asian



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American and Pacific Islander history education in 1 each school; and 2 3 4 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that in addition to teaching students about Asian American and Pacific Islander history, the 5 6 updated curriculum is requested to include a unit of instruction about how race shapes power structures and lived experience to 7 further teach students about their civic duty; and 8 9 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that each school complex area is 10 11 requested to determine the minimum amount of instructional time that qualifies as a unit of instruction in Asian American and 12 Pacific Islander history; and 13 14 15 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Superintendent of Education is requested to monitor each school complex area's compliance 16 with the Asian American and Pacific Islander history curriculum 17 requirements during their annual compliance visit; and 18 19 20 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Board of Education, 21 22 the Superintendent of Education, and the superintendents of each complex area in the State. 23 24 25 OFFERED BY: States 26
