SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE AUDITOR TO ASSESS BOTH THE SOCIAL AND FINANCIAL EFFECTS OF PROPOSED MANDATED HEALTH INSURANCE COVERAGE FOR A PERCENTAGE OF THE COSTS OF KETAMINE THERAPY TO TREAT DEPRESSION.

WHEREAS, the State has a duty to protect and improve the 1 health and environment of the people; and 2 3 WHEREAS, a number of state residents suffer from 4 5 depression; and 6 WHEREAS, according to an article published in Current 7 Neuropharmacology, the use of ketamine is a valid antidepressant 8 option for the treatment of treatment-resistant depression and 9 10 has rapid antidepressant effects; and 11 12 WHEREAS, Senate Bill No. 279, introduced during the Regular Session of 2023 proposes to require insurance coverage for 13 14 ketamine therapy; and 15 WHEREAS, section 23-51, Hawaii Revised Statutes, requires 16 that "[b]efore any legislative measure that mandates health 17 insurance coverage for specific health services, specific 18 19 diseases, or certain providers of health care services as part of individual or group health insurance policies, can be 20 considered, there shall be concurrent resolutions passed 21 22 requesting the auditor to prepare and submit to the legislature a report that assesses both the social and financial effects of 23 the proposed mandated coverage"; now, therefore, 24 25 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-second 26 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2023, the 27

House of Representatives concurring, that the Auditor is
requested to assess, pursuant to section 23-51, Hawaii Revised
Statutes, both the social and financial effects of the proposed



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mandated health insurance coverage under Senate Bill No. 279, 1 Regular Session of 2023, which requires insurance coverage for a 2 percentage of the costs of ketamine therapy to treat depression; 3 and 4 5 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Auditor is requested to 6 submit a report of its findings and recommendations, including 7 8 any proposed legislation, to the Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 9 2024; and 10 11 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 12 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Auditor and 13

14 Insurance Commissioner.
