SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION TO START HIGH SCHOOLS NO EARLIER THAN 9:00 A.M. AND ELEMENTARY AND MIDDLE SCHOOLS NO EARLIER THAN 8:30 A.M.

WHEREAS, all Hawaii keiki are entitled to a high quality 1 education; and 2 3 WHEREAS, the American Academy of Pediatrics recommends that 4 the first school bell ring no earlier than 8:30 a.m.; and 5 6 7 WHEREAS, early school start times are associated with 8 students sleeping less, irritability, and fatigue; and 9 10 WHEREAS, students who lack sufficient sleep may experience difficulty paying attention in class, negatively affecting 11 students' academic performance; and 12 13 WHEREAS, all but five public high schools begin their 14 school days before 8:30 a.m.; and 15 16 17 WHEREAS, prioritizing adequate amounts of sleep for all 18 students is one step to ensure positive student outcomes and academic success; now, therefore, 19 20

BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-second Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2023, the House of Representatives concurring, that the Department of Education is urged to adopt rules requiring that high schools start no earlier than 9:00 a.m. and elementary and middle schools start no earlier than 8:30 a.m.; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Education is requested to adjust state-provided bus routes and school meal service times accordingly; and
