SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING THE HAWAII EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT AGENCY TO INCLUDE IN ALL LIVE AND RECORDED EMERGENCY ALERT SYSTEM VIDEO BROADCASTS, AN ON-SCREEN INTERPRETER DISSEMINATING THE EMERGENCY INFORMATION IN AMERICAN SIGN LANGUAGE AT ALL TIMES, INCLUDING DURING GRAPHIC PRESENTATIONS.

1 WHEREAS, the Hawaii Emergency Management Agency established 2 within the State Department of Defense plans for and responds to 3 both natural and human-caused emergencies, including emergencies 4 resulting from all hazards, including tsunamis, wildfires, and 5 hurricanes, and incidents involving hazardous materials or 6 nuclear power; and

WHEREAS, the Hawaii Emergency Management Agency manages 8 Hawaii's Emergency Alert System (EAS), which is a public alert 9 and warning system that leverages the communications assets of 10 EAS participants, including terrestrial broadcasters, cable 11 television systems, wireless cable systems, satellite digital 12 audio radio service providers, direct broadcast satellite 13 services, and wireline video service providers, to allow the 14 President of the United States the capability to address the 15 American public during a national emergency; and 16 17

18 WHEREAS, Hawaii's EAS is also used by State and local 19 authorities to deliver important emergency information, 20 including America's Missing: Broadcast Emergency Response 21 (AMBER) alerts and the National Weather Service's emergency 22 weather alerts and advisories; and

24 WHEREAS, upon eruptions of volcanos, information that is 25 critical to the safety of Hawaii residents, including volcano 26 alert levels, aviation threat levels, seismic activity levels, 27 lava flow, and other threats to the community are disseminated 28 to the public through the EAS; and 29



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WHEREAS, due to the critical nature of EAS alerts and 1 warnings, and to prevent confusion caused by misinformation, 2 lack of information, or difficulty in finding accurate 3 information following sudden disasters, EAS broadcasts should be 4 provided using every communication tool available; and 5 6 WHEREAS, during the recent volcano eruptions on Hawaii 7 Island, the EAS live video broadcasts did not consistently 8 provide American Sign Language interpretation on screen, thereby 9 10 depriving many Hawaii residents who are deaf or hard of hearing of emergency information that is imperative for the protection 11 12 of their lives and property; now, therefore, 13 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-second 14 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2023, the 15 House of Representatives concurring, that the Hawaii Emergency 16 17 Management Agency is urged to: 18 Include in all live and recorded EAS video broadcasts, 19 (1)20 an on-screen interpreter disseminating the emergency information in American Sign Language at all times, 21 including during graphic presentations; 22 23 (2) Provide training for American Sign Language 24 interpreters by including them in all training 25 provided to EAS broadcasters; and 26 27 28 (3) Have all video broadcasts have one camera showing the American Sign Language interpreter at all times; and 29 30 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 31 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Governor and 32 Adjutant General. 33 34 35 36 THE I OFFERED BY
