## SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH'S SOLID WASTE SECTION TO DEVELOP A PLAN OF INITIATIVES FOR IMPROVED WASTE DIVERSION BY WORKING WITH THE COUNTIES TO ADDRESS EACH COUNTY'S UNIQUE NEEDS ACCORDING TO ITS GEOGRAPHY, POPULATION, AND INDUSTRY MAKE-UP.

1 WHEREAS, the Hawaii 2050 Sustainability Plan defines 2 sustainability as meeting the needs of the present without 3 compromising the ability of future generations to meet their own 4 needs; striking a balance between economic, social and 5 community, and environmental priorities; and respecting the 6 culture, character, beauty, and history of the State's island 7 communities; and

9 WHEREAS, Act 324, Session Laws of Hawaii 1991, was enacted
10 in 1991 to establish the landfill waste diversion goal of
11 twenty-five percent by 1995 and fifty percent by 2000; and

WHEREAS, in 2020, the United States Environmental
Protection Agency set its national landfill waste diversion goal
to be fifty percent by 2030; and

WHEREAS, from 2018 to 2022, the State's average waste
diversion rate was 24.8 percent, more than half the waste
diversion goal set in 1991; and

21 WHEREAS, from 2018 to 2022, the State's average waste 22 diversion rate, in addition to the incineration rate, was 54.3 23 percent, meeting the State's and United States Environmental 24 Protection Agency's diversion goals of fifty percent by 2000 and 25 2030, respectively; and

27 WHEREAS, incineration, or the use of waste-to-energy
28 technology, is a strategy for reducing the State's solid waste

from landfills, while extracting energy and valuable materials 1 for recycling; and 2 3 WHEREAS, each county's solid waste management agency has 4 autonomy within its county to negotiate, collect, recycle, 5 reuse, or dispose of waste within the county in a manner that 6 reflects that county's unique needs; and 7 8 WHEREAS, part III of chapter 342G, Hawaii Revised Statutes, 9 authorizes each county to develop county integrated solid waste 10 management plans and requires that these plans be submitted for 11 public review and comment and state review; and 12 13 WHEREAS, these county waste management plans are guidelines 14 15 that offer direction and an implementation plan but do not penalize or enforce losses if a county fails to meet the goals; 16 17 and 18 19 WHEREAS, the State's current role in this process is to integrate the counties' goals and provide a framework for what 20 counties should accomplish, as well as to recognize challenges 21 that each county faces; and 22 23 WHEREAS, many of the counties' waste management plans 24 incorporate existing county documents, such as Hawaii County's 25 Zero Waste Plan and Maui County's Recycling Initiative, and 26 these existing plans may be reviewed and incorporated statewide 27 based on feasibility; and 28 29 WHEREAS, given the public's support, the State's 30 initiatives may be more effective if each county's goals are 31 incorporated into combined goals for all levels of government; 32 33 now, therefore, 34 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-second 35 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2023, the 36 37 House of Representatives concurring, that the Department of Health's Solid Waste Section is requested to, subject to the 38 availability of funding, investigate strategies for improved 39 waste diversion by working with the counties to address each 40 county's unique needs according to its geography, population, 41 42 and industry make-up; and
