SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII TO CONVENE A WORKING GROUP TO CREATE A PLAN FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A MARITIME COLLEGE AND TO ESTABLISH A MARITIME COLLEGE.

WHEREAS, the maritime industry is the most important part of the State's critical supply chain and a longstanding source 2 of family-sustaining union jobs; and 3 4 5 WHEREAS, there is a shortage of licensed mariners in the 6 State; and 8 WHEREAS, employers more frequently hire licensed mariners who have graduated with a baccalaureate degree from an accredited maritime college; and 10 11 WHEREAS, maritime colleges award baccalaureate degrees and 12 prepare students for International Convention on Standards of 13 Training, Certification and Watchkeeping for Seafarers 14 certification and licensing by the United States Coast Guard; 15 16 and 17 WHEREAS, there is no maritime college in Hawaii; and 18 19 WHEREAS, Hawaii residents must leave the State to receive 20 the education necessary for a maritime career; and 21 22 WHEREAS, maritime colleges are routinely highly ranked in 23 degree value and social mobility; and 24 25 WHEREAS, maritime colleges have an outstanding reputation 26 27 for offering career pathways that improve the economic conditions of frontline and marginalized communities; and 28 29

WHEREAS, the University of Hawaii is the premier higher education institution in the State and serves the intellectual, educational, research, and workforce development interests of the people of Hawaii; and
