SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY TO SUBMIT A REPORT TO THE LEGISLATURE DETAILING THE DEPARTMENT'S PROCESS IN ASSISTING INMATES IN OBTAINING IDENTIFICATION CARDS.

WHEREAS, the Legislature has been working to facilitate the 1 reentry of returning citizens back to their families and 2 communities after exiting incarceration; and 3 4 5 WHEREAS, past legislatures have appropriated funds to the Department of Public Safety to start the process of reentry by 6 ensuring that everyone who is released from incarceration has a 7 valid identification card; and 8 9 WHEREAS, the Department of Public Safety is transitioning 10 to a rehabilitative and therapeutic model; and 11 12 13 WHEREAS, ensuring that persons exiting incarceration are released with a valid identification card will facilitate their 14 15 reentry; and 16 17 WHEREAS, the use of public funds allocated for ensuring that each person is released from incarceration with a valid 18 19 identification card should be public information; and 20 WHEREAS, in 2016, the Legislature appropriated \$25,000 to 21 the Department of Public safety for the purpose of creating 22 identification cards for inmates; and 23 24 WHEREAS, the Department of Public Safety encountered 25 problems with the implementation of the 2016 program; and 26 27 WHEREAS, in 2022 the Legislature appropriated \$100,000 to 28 the Department of Public Safety to purchase machines for data 29 input at each facility to implement the identification card 30 program; now, therefore, 31 32
