SENATE RESOLUTION

URGING THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION AND HAWAI'I ASSOCIATION OF INDEPENDENT SCHOOLS TO EXPAND THE REVITALIZATION OF THE FUTURE FARMERS OF AMERICA AND 4-H YOUTH PROGRAMS TO SUPPORT PATHWAYS TO AGRICULTURE CAREERS IN HAWAII.

WHEREAS, Hawaii imports more than eighty-five percent of 1 its food and is considered highly vulnerable in issues of food 2 3 security; and 4 WHEREAS, the State has since recognized this vulnerability 5 and has initiated a major policy pivot towards food and 6 agricultural self-sufficiency to lessen its reliance on imported 7 8 food products; and 9 WHEREAS, this transitional undertaking requires serious and 10 careful investment into the local agricultural sector and 11 related trades, particularly through the expansion of education 12 and training opportunities for the next generation of farmers; 13 and 14 15 WHEREAS, the current lack of young farmers and ranchers 16 with the experience, skills, and ambition required to undertake 17 the rigorous and complex work of farming and ranching as a 18 business poses a significant hurdle to vitalizing local 19 agriculture; and 20 21 WHEREAS, Future Farmers of America is a national nonprofit 22 youth and student organization that promotes and supports 23 agricultural education in middle and high school classrooms and 24 currently has thirteen active chapters and over one hundred 25 fifty members in Hawaii; and 26 27 WHEREAS, 4-H is national network of youth organizations and 28 is currently delivered by Cooperative Extension, a community of 29 more than one hundred public universities across the nation, 30 which provides children and teens with opportunities to complete 31 32 hands-on projects in agriculture and other areas; and in Hawaii, Cooperative Extension is a program of the University of Hawaii 33



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at Manoa College of Tropical Agriculture and Human Resources; 1 2 and 3 WHEREAS, agriculture education emphasizes and requires 4 5 skill and knowledge in the areas of science, technology, engineering, mathematics, and the arts and can prepare students 6 7 for careers in global agriculture, food and fiber production, and management of natural resources systems that offer 8 9 competitive salaries; and 10 WHEREAS, Future Farmers of America and 4-H offer students 11 pathways to careers in Hawaii with companies and agencies that 12 often must resort to searching out-of-state for skilled workers 13 and farmers due to the lack of local agricultural labor; now, 14 therefore, 15 16 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-second 17 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2023, 18 that the Department of Education and the Hawai'i Association of 19 Independent Schools, in consultation with the University of 20 Hawaii at Manoa Cooperative Extension, are urged to expand the 21 revitalization of the Future Farmers of America and 4-H youth 22 programs and reestablish and strengthen pathways for youth to 23 find careers in agriculture; and 24 25 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 26 Resolution be transmitted to the Chairperson of the Board of 27 Education, the Superintendent of Education, the President of the 28 Hawai'i Association of Independent Schools, and the Associate 29 Dean and Associate Director for Cooperative Extension at the 30 University of Hawaii College of Tropical Agriculture and Human 31 Resources. 32 33 34 35

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
