SENATE RESOLUTION

AMENDING THE RULES OF THE SENATE TO ESTABLISH THAT A FAILURE TO SUBMIT TO A BREATHALYZER TEST, BLOOD TEST, OR FIELD SOBRIETY TEST DURING A LAWFUL STOP SHALL BE GROUNDS FOR EXPULSION.

WHEREAS, state legislators have a responsibility to lead by 1 example and behave in a manner that is consistent with public 2 3 safety; and 4 5 WHEREAS, safe roads are an essential component of everyday 6 life; and 7 8 WHEREAS, the presence of intoxicated drivers jeopardizes the safety of public roads; and 9 10 11 WHEREAS, breathalyzer tests, blood tests, and field sobriety tests for intoxication are essential components of 12 13 ensuring that intoxicated drivers are held accountable; and 14 15 WHEREAS, while everyday citizen drivers have the right to refuse to submit to breathalyzer tests, blood tests, and field 16 sobriety tests when they are stopped by police upon suspicion of 17 intoxicated driving, state legislators should be held to a 18 higher standard; and 19 20 21 WHEREAS, Article III, Section 12 of the Hawaii State Constitution provides that each house of the Legislature "shall 22 have, for misconduct, disorderly behavior or neglect of duty of 23 any member, power to punish such member by censure or, upon a 24 two-thirds vote of all the members to which such house is 25 entitled, by suspension or expulsion of such member"; now, 26 27 therefore, 28 29 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-second Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2023, 30

2 rule to be appropriately designated and to read as follows: 3 4 "Rule . Refusal to Submit to Breathalyzer, Blood, or Field Sobriety Tests. 5 6 If any member operating a motor vehicle is subject to 7 a lawful stop by a law enforcement officer, and the officer 8 requests that the member submit to a breathalyzer, blood, 9 or field sobriety test, or any combination of the foregoing 10 tests, the member shall consent. A member's failure to 11 comply with this rule shall be deemed an act of misconduct 12 and shall be grounds for expulsion, pursuant to 13 Article III, Section 12 of the Constitution of the State of 14 Hawaii. 15 16 provided that the formatting of the rule may be changed to 17 conform to the formatting of most recent version of the Rules of 18 the Senate; and 19 20 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the new rule shall take effect 21 on the date of the adoption of this measure; and 22 23 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 24 25 Resolution be transmitted to each member of this chamber. 26 27 28 OFFERED BY:
