SENATE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE AND CONSUMER AFFAIRS AND THE CONTRACTORS LICENSE BOARD TO ENSURE THAT THE CONTRACTORS LICENSE BOARD INCLUDES AT LEAST TWO MEMBERS WITH EXPERTISE IN SPECIALTY STRUCTURAL CONTRACTING.

WHEREAS, the Legislature finds that construction industry 1 review boards, such as the Contractors License Board, are 2 3 necessary to protect the health, safety, and welfare of the 4 general public; and 5 WHEREAS, the Legislature has also established, for example, 6 the special Board of Electricians and Plumbers to ensure that 7 the licensure for these specialized trades are reviewed and 8 administered appropriately; and 9 10 WHEREAS, a General Engineering Contractor or General 11 12 Building Contractor is required to ensure that the subcontractors and workers assigned to install and erect 13 specialized steel structures, like those performing welding 14 services, have sufficient knowledge and experience to maintain a 15 safe work environment and make certain the installation and 16 construction of the specialized structure is properly done; and 17 18 19 WHEREAS, General Engineering Contractor licenses and General Building Contractor licenses issued by the Contractors 20 License Board automatically hold a number of specialty 21 22 classifications without requiring further examination or payment of additional fees, a number of which may greatly influence the 23 structural integrity of a building, namely: 24 25 (1) C-6 Carpentry Framing; 26 27 28 (2) C-31 Masonry; 29 30 (3) C-32 Ornamental, Guardrail, and Fencing; 31

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(4) C-35 Pile Driving; Pile and Caisson Drilling; 1 2 3 (5) C-38 Post Tensioning; 4 (6) C-41 Reinforcing Steel; 5 6 (7) C-48 Structural Welding; and 7 8 9 (8) C-56 Welding; and 10 WHEREAS, Specialty Contractor licenses, however, do not 11 automatically include additional specialty classifications but 12 are instead issued according to nearly one hundred different 13 subclassifications that require special skills, or to those 14 whose principal contracting business involves the use of 15 specialized building trades or crafts, including the eight 16 structure-related subclassifications identified above; and 17 18 WHEREAS, existing law requires that the Contractors License 19 Board include five Specialty Contractors in its membership, but 20 does not require diversity among the many specialty 21 subclassifications; and 22 23 WHEREAS, the composition of members on the Contractors 24 License Board should include at least two members who are 25 Specialty Contractors with experience in at least one of the 26 27 eight structural trades identified above; and 28 WHEREAS, the Legislature finds that the public's health, 29 safety, and welfare may be unduly put at risk without 30 specialized structural contracting expertise being represented 31 on the Contractors License Board; now, therefore, 32 33 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-second 34 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2023, 35 that the Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs and 36 37 Contractors License Board are requested to ensure that the Contractors License Board includes, at all times, at least two 38 Specialty Contractor members licensed in at least one of the 39 eight structural contracting subclassifications listed above; 40 provided that the license was not issued automatically as a 41

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1 result of holding a General Engineering Contractor license or a General Building Contractor license; and 2 3 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Commerce and 4 Consumer Affairs, in conjunction with the Contractors License 5 6 Board, is requested to consider: 7 8 (1)The feasibility of establishing an advisory committee 9 focused on structural contracting issues within the 10 existing Board composition to enhance sensitivity and attention given to structural contracting issues; and 11 12 13 (2) Whether the Contractors License Board's existing 14 administrative rules that allow for the automatic issuance of certain specialty licenses enumerated 15 16 above for General Engineering Contractors and General 17 Building Contractors, without further examination or fees, are prudent and sufficiently ensure the health, 18 19 safety, and welfare of the public; and 20 21 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Commerce and 22 Consumer Affairs, in conjunction with the Contractors License 23 Board, is requested to submit a report on its findings, including any proposed legislation, to the Legislature no later 24 25 than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2024; and 26 27 28 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Resolution be transmitted to the Director of Commerce 29 30 and Consumer Affairs and Chairperson of the Contractors License Board. 31 32 OFFERED BY: Thurt Faile 33 34
