SENATE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE GOVERNOR'S COORDINATOR ON HOMELESSNESS TO CONDUCT A STUDY ON THE COST OF PROGRAMS AND SERVICES NECESSARY TO END CHRONIC HOMELESSNESS BY 2030.

WHEREAS, homelessness is a persistent public policy and 1 humanitarian concern for Hawaii; and 2 3 4 WHEREAS, the 2022 Point-In-Time Count tallied a total of 5 5,973 people experiencing homelessness in the State, with the 6 majority of the people counted living on Oahu at 3,951 7 individuals, followed by Hawai'i County with 837 individuals, Maui County with 741 individuals, and Kaua'i County with 444 8 9 individuals; and 10 WHEREAS, the 2022 Point-In-Time Count showed an eleven 11 12 percent decrease in Oahu's total homeless population from 2020, but a slightly higher number of unsheltered individuals living 13 14 on the streets; and 15 WHEREAS, there was also a significant drop in the number of 16 individuals counted in shelters on Oahu in 2022 as compared to 17 2020, with 1,596 individuals counted in shelters in 2022 and 18 19 2,102 individuals counted in shelters in 2020; and 20 WHEREAS, the decline in the number of individuals counted 21 22 in shelters may be attributable to a decrease in statewide bed 23 capacity caused by shelter closures and COVID-19 restrictions; 24 and 25 26 WHEREAS, statistics show that while Native Hawaiian and 27 Pacific Islander populations make up approximately ten percent 28 of the total population on Oahu, they represent more than thirty-five percent of those experiencing homelessness; and 29 30

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1 WHEREAS, the current Governor has vowed to prioritize efforts to cut homelessness in half and eliminate chronic 2 homelessness by 2030; now, therefore, 3 4 5 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-second Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2023, 6 that the Governor's Coordinator on Homelessness is requested to 7 conduct a study on the cost of programs and services necessary 8 to end chronic homelessness by 2030; and 9 10 11 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Governor's Coordinator on Homeless is requested to consider in the study the cost of 12 shelter space, transitional housing, permanent supportive 13 housing, housing assistance, stabilization facilities, substance 14 abuse treatment, health care, mental health services, outreach 15 programming, and other social services necessary to end chronic 16 17 homelessness; and 18 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Governor's Coordinator on 19 Homelessness is requested to consult with other governmental and 20 nongovernmental organizations to perform the study, including 21 the Department of Human Services, The Institute for Human 22 Services, Partners In Care, and Hawai'i Appleseed Center for Law 23 & Economic Justice; and 24 25 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Governor's Coordinator on 26 27 Homelessness is requested to submit the results of the study on the cost of ending chronic homelessness by 2030, including any 28 findings, recommendations, and proposed legislation, to the 29 Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of 30 the Regular Session of 2024; and 31 32 33 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 34 Resolution be transmitted to the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, Director of Human Services, Governor's Coordinator on 35 36 Homelessness, Executive Director of the Institute for Human Services, Executive Director of Partners In Care, and Executive 37 38 Director of the Hawai'i Appleseed Center for Law & Economic 39 Justice. 40 41

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
