SENATE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A WORKING GROUP TO EVALUATE NEW ZEALAND'S MODEL OF DECRIMINALIZING PROSTITUTION AND MAKE RECOMMENDATIONS ON HOW TO AMEND HAWAII LAWS TO DECRIMINALIZE PROSTITUTION.

WHEREAS, prostitution is currently illegal in Hawaii; and 1 2 3 WHEREAS, there is a growing body of research suggesting that the decriminalization of prostitution could provide 4 5 benefits to sex workers, their clients, and the broader 6 community; and 7 8 WHEREAS, New Zealand is one of the few countries that has decriminalized prostitution, with the passage of the 9 Prostitution Reform Act 2003; and 10 11 12 WHEREAS, the New Zealand model has been in place for almost twenty years, and there is a significant body of research on its 13 effects on sex workers, their clients, and the broader 14 15 community; and 16 17 WHEREAS, the Legislature would benefit from a thorough evaluation of the New Zealand model and its potential 18 application to Hawaii; now, therefore, 19 20 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-second 21 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2023, 22 that the Provost of the University of Hawaii at Manoa is 23 requested to designate a faculty member of the Department of 24 25 Women, Gender, and Sexual Studies of the University of Hawaii at Manoa College of Social Sciences to establish a working group to 26 evaluate New Zealand's model of decriminalizing prostitution and 27 make recommendations on how to amend Hawaii laws to 28) decriminalize prostitution; and 29 30 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the faculty member designated 31 32 to establish the working group is requested to serve as the chair of the working group and invite other individuals to 33 become members of the working group; and 34

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1 2 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that members of the working group 3 shall serve without compensation; and 4 5 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the working group is 6 specifically requested to: 7 8 (1)Study the effects of New Zealand's model of 9 decriminalizing prostitution on sex workers, their clients, and the broader community; 10 11 (2) Consider the potential impacts of decriminalizing 12 prostitution in Hawaii, including impacts on public 13 health and safety, sex worker rights and protections, 14 and law enforcement; and 15 16 17 (3) Make recommendations for amending Hawaii laws to decriminalize prostitution, including any necessary 18 19 changes to health and safety regulations, criminal penalties, and labor laws; and 20 21 22 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the working group is requested to submit a report of its findings and recommendations, 23 including any proposed legislation, to the Legislature no later 24 than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session 25 26 of 2024; and 27 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 28 29 Resolution be transmitted to the Provost of the University of Hawaii at Manoa and the Department Chair of the Department of 30 Women, Gender, and Sexual Studies of the University of Hawaii at 31 Manoa College of Social Sciences. 32 33 34 35 OFFERED BY: Carre Julianage
