HB 464 RELATING TO MAGNET SCHOOLS. EDN, FIN Status Establishes a five-year magnet school pilot program at Waiahole and Ka'a'awa elementary schools. Establishes eight full-time equivalent (8.0 FTE) positions. Appropriates funds. <u>HB 246</u> RELATING TO EDUCATION. EDN, FIN Status Requires the department of education to employ one full-time equivalent counselor, vice principal, and media specialist at each department school. Appropriates funds. RELATING TO EDUCATION. HB 850 EDN, FIN Appropriates funds for one twelve-month complex area trauma-Status informed resource teacher permanent position and one district educational specialist II permanent position for the Castle-Kahuku complex area. HB 830 RELATING TO THE HAWAII SCHOOL FOR THE DEAF AND EDN, FIN **Status** BLIND. Requires the Department of Education to meet with Hawaii School for the Deaf and Blind stakeholders and members of the Hawaii deaf community regarding the development of a plan to transition the Hawaii School for the Deaf and Blind to a conversion charter school. Requires a report to the Legislature. RELATING TO CIVIC EDUCATION. HB 741 EDN, FIN Status Appropriates funds to the department of education for the expansion of civic education in the public schools. Establishes two full-time equivalent permanent civic education resource teacher positions, one of which shall be grant funded. **HB** 79 RELATING TO MEDIA LITERACY. EDN, FIN **Status** Authorizes school complexes to incorporate media literacy in its standards-based curriculum, including content that prevents negative impacts of misinformation, disinformation, digital discrimination, and online hate speech. RELATING TO AUTHENTIC ASSESSMENTS. EDN, FIN HB 80 Status Authorizes public school complex areas to use authentic assessments as part of classroom-based performance assessments. HB 497, HD1 RELATING TO HOUSING. HSG, EDN, FIN (HSCR35) Requires the school facilities authority to conduct a feasibility study **Status** for the development of teacher and workforce housing at the Queen Liliuokalani elementary school property. Requires a report to the legislature prior to the 2024 regular session. Appropriates funds for the feasibility study. Effective 7/1/3000. (HD1) RELATING TO SCHOOL CAMPUSES. HB 1256, HD1 HSG, EDN, FIN (HSCR154) Establishes and appropriates moneys for a Maui campus housing pilot Status program, to be administered by the school facilities authority which

shall make on-campus housing available to employees at Lahainaluna and Kulanihakoi high schools on the island of Maui. Requires the school facilities authority and department of education to submit

reports to the Legislature. Effective 6/30/3000. (HD1)

<u>HB 1117, HD1</u> (<u>HSCR159</u>) Status

RELATING TO TEACHER RENTAL HOUSING.

Authorizes HHFDC to assist DOE in developing teacher housing projects and contract or sponsor an experimental or demonstration housing project with any state department or agency. Appropriates funds for deposit into the dwelling unit revolving fund. Authorizes DOE to lease land and contract with private entities for the development, management, maintenance, or revitalization of teacher housing. Permits a private entity to lease teacher housing to other eligible tenants if occupancy of teacher housing falls below a threshold as determined by DOE. Effective 6/30/3000. (HD1)

DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW

Persons wishing to offer comments should submit testimony at least <u>24 hours</u> prior to the hearing. Testimony received after this time will be stamped late and left to the discretion of the chair to consider. While every effort will be made to incorporate all testimony received, materials received on the day of the hearing or improperly identified or directed, may not be processed.

Testimony submitted will be placed on the legislative website. This public posting of testimony on the website should be considered when including personal information in your testimony.

The chair may institute a per-testifier time limit.

Committees meeting in the morning must adjourn prior to the day's Floor Session. Therefore, due to time constraints, not all testifiers may be provided an opportunity to offer verbal comments. However, written submissions will be considered by the committee.
