SB 814 Status & Testimony	RELATING TO ELECTRONIC INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY ACCESSIBILITY FOR PERSONS WITH LIMITED ENGLISH PROFICIENCY. Requires the Office of Enterprise Technology Services, in consultation with the Office of Language Access and a working group composed of stakeholders, to develop and publish, and periodically review and update, electronic information technology multilingual accessibility standards to be implemented by all state entities.	GVO, WAM
Status & Testimony	RELATING TO PUBLIC AGENCY MEETINGS. Requires a Public Agency Board to report any discussion or final action taken during an executive meeting; provided that such disclosure is not inconsistent with the purpose of convening the executive meeting, but giving the Board discretion to maintain confidentiality.	GVO, JDC
SB 1564 Status & Testimony	RELATING TO PUBLIC RECORDS. Allows a requestor of a public record to receive the public record in the format of their choice; provided that the format that is being requested is available.	GVO, JDC

Status & Testimony	RELATING TO GIFTS. Establishes procedures for the custody, inventory, and care of protocol gifts received by members of either house of the Legislature or state employees.	GVO, JDC
Status & Testimony	RELATING TO LOBBYISTS. Expands the definition of "administrative action" in lobbyists law to include granting or denying applications for business or development-related permits, licenses, or approvals and procurement of goods and services under the Hawaii Public Procurement Code. Clarifies that the lobbyists law apply to lobbying of the executive branch.	GVO, JDC
Status & Testimony	RELATING TO THE ADVICE AND CONSENT OF THE SENATE. Requires nominees for the position of Deputy Director, First Deputy, or Deputy Chair, as the case may be, of principal departments to be subject to advice and consent of the Senate.	GVO, JDC
Status & Testimony	RELATING TO PUBLIC PROCUREMENT. Clarifies the deadline for submitting written protests that are based on the content of a solicitation.	GVO, JDC
Status & Testimony	RELATING TO PROCUREMENT. Allows agencies to rank fewer than three persons for professional services when fewer than three qualified persons respond to the solicitation or request to use alternative procurement procedures when no qualified person responds to the solicitation.	GVO, WAM
