<p><u>HB 948, HD2</u> <u>(HSCR1098)</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u></p>	<p>RELATING TO CHILD AND ADOLESCENT MENTAL HEALTH. Establishes a two-year child and adolescent crisis mobile outreach team pilot program on Oahu and one neighbor island site to expand existing crisis response services. Appropriates funds. Effective 6/30/3000. (HD2)</p>	<p>HHS, WAM</p>
<p><u>HB 1366, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR963)</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u></p>	<p>RELATING TO HOMELESSNESS. Requires the department of human services to establish a three-year return-to-home pilot program to return homeless individuals in the State to families and relatives in their home states. <p><u>HB 546, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR1206)</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u></p>	<p>RELATING TO THE FUEL TANK ADVISORY COMMITTEE. Requires the Fuel Tank Advisory Committee to hold no fewer than one regular meeting in each quarter of a calendar year. Appropriates funds. Effective 6/30/3000. (HD1)</p>	<p>HHS, WAM</p>
<p><u>HB 907, HD2</u> <u>(HSCR903)</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u></p>	<p>RELATING TO TELEHEALTH. Authorizes reimbursement of telehealth services provided by way of an interactive telecommunications system be reimbursed. Effective 6/30/3000. (HD2)</p>	<p>HHS, CPN</p>
<p><u>HB 248, HD2</u> <u>(HSCR1048)</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u></p>	<p>RELATING TO PRESCRIPTION DRUGS. Requires certain pharmacies to provide accessible prescription drug label information to individuals who have difficulty seeing or reading prescription drug container labels and inform the public that prescription drug label information is available in alternate accessible formats for individuals who have difficulty seeing or reading prescription drug container labels. Requires the board of pharmacy to adopt certain rules by 12/31/2025. Effective 6/30/3000. (HD2)</p>	<p>HHS, CPN [Measure deleted on 03-14-23]</p>
<p><u>HB 1245, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR1037)</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u></p>	<p>RELATING TO AMBULANCES. <p><u>HB 1255, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR986)</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u></p>	<p>RELATING TO SPECIAL PURPOSE REVENUE BONDS. Authorizes the issuance of special purpose revenue bonds to assist West Maui Hospital Foundation, Inc. in the construction of West Maui Hospital and Medical Center in the county of Maui, including any necessary infrastructure. Requires the county of Maui to serve as guarantor of any debt service on the special purpose revenue bonds. Effective 6/30/3000. (HD1)</p>	<p>HHS, WAM</p>
