HB 1081 Status	RELATING TO PENALTIES FOR UNLICENSED CARE HOMES. Clarifies the penalty to be assessed on any person who intentionally operates a care facility without a certificate or license.	HLT, JHA, FIN
HB 914 Status	RELATING TO HEALTH. Clarifies who is prohibited from knowingly referring or transferring patients to an uncertified or unlicensed care facility. Repeals the landlord exclusion. Requires the department of health to prioritize complaint allegations based on severity for inspections of statelicensed or state-certified care facilities.	НСТ, СРС, ЈНА
HB 872 Status	RELATING TO THE HAWAII HEALTHY AGING PARTNERSHIP. Appropriates funds to the Executive Office on Aging within the Department of Health for the Hawaii Healthy Aging Partnership.	HLT, FIN
HB 278 Status	RELATING TO HEALTH. Appropriates funds for the executive office on aging to create an Alzheimer's disease public health campaign.	HLT, FIN

HB 838 RELATING TO LONG-TERM CARE. HLT, FIN

Reestablishes the long-term care commission within the University of Hawaii college of social sciences public policy center to identify

further needed reforms of Hawaii's long-term care system.

Appropriates moneys.

HB 1263 RELATING TO THE HAWAII ABLE SAVINGS PROGRAM. HLT, FIN

Status Authorizes the director of finance to use funds deposited into the

Hawaii ABLE savings program trust fund for any expenses incurred in developing and administering the Hawaii ABLE savings program. Establishes a position within the state council on developmental disabilities of the department of health to support the Hawaii ABLE

savings program. Appropriates funds.

HB 871 RELATING TO SERVICE ANIMALS. HLT, CPC, FIN

Status Requires that a disclaimer be provided by sellers or providers of

emotional support animals or certificates, identifications, tags, vests, leashes, and harnesses for emotional support animals that the animal is

not a service animal. Establishes penalties.

HB 1433 RELATING TO BEHAVIORAL HEALTH CRISIS HLT, FIN

Status STABILIZATION BEDS.

Status

Appropriates funds to the Adult Mental Health Division of the Department of Health to support increased behavioral health crisis stabilization beds. Creates a working group to get county input on possible sites for these crisis stabilization beds. Effective 7/1/2023.

DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW
