## AMENDED AGENDA

**SB 340** RELATING TO HOUSING. HOU, WAM

Appropriates funds to the Hawaii Public Housing Authority for Status & the rehabilitation, remodeling, renovation, and repair of housing **Testimony** units.

RELATING TO THE CONVEYANCE TAX. HOU, WAM **SB 362** 

Increases the rate of conveyance tax for condominiums and Status & single family residences ineligible for a county homeowner's Testimony exemption with a value of at least \$2,000,000. Exempts from the conveyance tax documents and instruments conveying real property subject to a government assistance program approved and certified by the Hawaii housing finance and development corporation and used for the provision of affordable housing for qualified persons in the State. Removes maximum dollar amount of conveyance tax revenues that are to be paid into the

rental housing revolving fund each fiscal year. Effective

1/1/2024.

**SB 489** RELATING TO THE AFFORDABLE HOUSING REVOLVING HOU, WAM FUND. Status & Amends the Supplemental Appropriations Act of 2022 to specify Testimony that the appropriation for Hawaii housing finance and development corporation (BED160) is to be deposited into and expended from the affordable homeownership revolving fund for purposes of the revolving fund. RELATING TO HOUSING. HOU, WAM **SB 858** Requires Hawaii Housing Finance and Development Status & Corporation to amend the Low-Income Housing Tax Credit **Testimony** Program and Qualified Allocation Plan to allow up to twenty per cent of the maximum one hundred-twenty points on the criteria point system to be allocated to projects offering to convey ownership of the completed project to the State or an organization obliged to use all financial surpluses generated by the project to construct more housing and prioritize applicants based on the timeliness and loan amount repaid to the Rental Housing Revolving Fund. RELATING TO THE HAWAII HOUSING FINANCE AND **SB 859** HOU, WAM DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION. Status & Establishes priority for projects that are awarded funds from the Testimony Rental Housing Revolving Fund that are owned by the State or an organization obliged to reinvest financial surplus generated by a completed project into a newly constructed housing project. Requires the Hawaii Housing Finance and Development Corporation to amend Hawaii Administrative Rules to award application criteria points to projects that fulfill these criteria and prioritize applications based on timing and loan amount repaid early. RELATING TO HOMELESSNESS. HOU, WAM SB 881 Authorizes the issuance of general obligation bonds to the [Measure deleted Hawaii Public Housing Authority for the development and 01-31-23] **Testimony** construction of permanent supportive housing for certain vulnerable individuals. Requires the Hawaii Housing Finance and Development Corporation to consider any available federal low-income housing tax credits needed for construction of permanent supportive housing units. RELATING TO HOUSING. **SB 936** HOU, WAM Requires the Hawaii Housing Finance and Development Status & Corporation to prioritize the allocation of low-income housing tax **Testimony** credits to state-owned development projects. RELATING TO HOUSING. **SB 999** HOU, WAM

Decision Making to follow, if time permits.

Appropriates funds to the Hawaii Public Housing Authority to

modernize Hale Poai.
