(SSCR1169) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO COLLECTIVE BARGAINING. Establishes that the representative of labor on the Hawaii Labor Relations Board be a person selected by a majority of the exclusive representatives of the collective bargaining units. Effective 6/30/3000. (SD1)	LBT, JDC
(SSCR1148) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO TRESPASS. Clarifies that when trespass involves public land, all state and county law enforcement officers may enforce trespass laws, without regard to whether the land is owned by the State or by a county. (SD1)	WTL, JDC
(SSCR1179) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO NEPOTISM. Beginning 7/1/2023, prohibits under certain circumstances state employees from hiring or promoting relatives and household members and from making or participating in certain other employment-related decisions and from awarding a contract to or otherwise taking official action on a contract with a business if the employee's relative or household member is an executive officer of or holds a substantial ownership interest in that business.
