### **HEARING**

HB 77 RELATING TO TEACHERS. LGO, EDN, FIN Clarifies that public charter school teachers and other personnel

employed by public charter schools under the same pay schedule are

included in collective bargaining unit (5).

HB 800 RELATING TO CHILD CARE. LGO, HUS, FIN

Status Requires the Department of Accounting and General Services to

establish and operate a child care center pilot program on Oahu for eligible children of state employees, one in or near the state capitol and

one in Kapolei. Appropriates funds. Repeals on 6/30/2028.

<u>HB 875</u> RELATING TO EDUCATION. LGO, HET, FIN

<u>Status</u> Establishes and appropriates funds for the Hawaii teacher

apprenticeship program to support, recruit, develop, and retain teachers

for Hawaii public schools.

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HB 977 Status RELATING TO PURCHASES OF HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES.

LGO, CPC, FIN

Abolishes the Community Council on purchase of health and human services

HB 978 Status RELATING TO PURCHASES OF HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES.

LGO, CPC, FIN

Authorizes heads of purchasing agencies to issue requests for statements of qualification and to establish lists of qualified providers for treatment purchase of services. Increases the small purchase threshold for health and human services.

HB 1206 Status

RELATING TO A STATE PERMITTING OFFICE.

LGO, WAL, FIN

Establishes the State Permitting Office within the Department of Accounting and General Services to process building and infrastructure permits for construction of state-owned buildings, state roads and highways, and other construction on state lands. Appropriates moneys.

HB 1363 Status RELATING TO TAXATION.

LGO, HSG, FIN

Extends the period in which a county may adopt a surcharge on state tax, under certain conditions, from 3/31/2019 to 12/31/2023. Authorizes the use of county surcharge revenues for housing infrastructure. Temporarily authorizes counties that have previously adopted a surcharge on state tax to amend the rates and uses of the surcharge.

HB 1409 Status RELATING TO EMPLOYEE BENEFITS.

LGO, CPC, FIN

Expands the State's temporary disability insurance (TDI) coverage to, and exempt from TDI benefit eligibility requirements that are employment-related, employees who are unable to perform their employment duties due to the employee's childbirth or provision of kangaroo care to, or expression of breast milk for, the employee's child who is required to stay in a neonatal intensive care unit. Extend under certain conditions, the temporary disability benefit payment period and family leave period for employees who are unable to perform their employment duties due to a preterm birth of a child who is required to stay in a neonatal intensive care unit or birth of a child who is required to stay in a neonatal intensive care unit for more than eight weeks. Defines "kangaroo care" and "preterm birth". Requires the Department of Health to amend its rules to include neonatal care as related condition where the phrase "pregnancy, childbirth, or other related condition" is used.

HB 163 Status RELATING TO COLLECTIVE BARGAINING.

LGO, FIN

Requires the employer to initiate negotiations on repricing of classes within a bargaining unit within 30 days of its receipt of the exclusive representative's written request to negotiate. Establishes that the employer's failure to initiate the negotiation within such time frame and the parties' failure to reach an agreement within ninety day of the exclusive representative's written request to negotiate or by January 31 of a year in which the collective bargaining agreement is due to expire, whichever is earlier, constitute an impasse to which the impasse procedures in section 89-11, Hawaii Revised Statutes, shall apply.

HB 164 Status	RELATING TO PROFESSIONAL LICENSE FEE RENEWALS. Requires each public employer to pay for the employer's employees' professional license renewal fees.	LGO, FIN
HB 165 Status	RELATING TO INTERNAL COMPLAINT PROCEDURES. Clarifies internal complaint procedures for civil service positions by requiring a formal complaint to be filed within twenty working days.	LGO, FIN
HB 167 Status	RELATING TO WAGES.  Makes general contractors entering into or under contracts in the State for work on buildings, structures, or other private works liable for debt incurred by subcontractors for wages due to claimants for performance of labor in the contract between the general contractor and owner.	LGO, JHA
HB 187 Status	RELATING TO RENEWABLE ENERGY. Establishes labor requirements for the construction of renewable energy projects with a capacity rating of ten megawatts or greater.	LGO, CPC
HB 257 Status	RELATING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN RESOURCES DEVELOPMENT. Appropriates moneys to the Department of Human Resources Development for the establishment of new employee positions and the learning management system.	LGO, FIN
HB 302 Status	RELATING TO WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT. Establishes the state YouthBuild program to assist non-profit and public entities in applying and qualifying for federal YouthBuild program grants. Authorizes the department of labor and industrial relations to award grants to eligible non-profit or public entities to meet the matching funds requirement for federal YouthBuild grant awards. Appropriates funds.	LGO, FIN
HB 333 Status	RELATING TO PUBLIC EMPLOYEE COMPENSATION. Repeals payroll day for public officers and employees by requiring them to be paid pursuant to a predicted payroll schedule, rather than an after-the-fact payroll schedule.	LGO, FIN
HB 334 Status	RELATING TO EMPLOYER-UNION HEALTH BENEFITS TRUST FUND CONTRIBUTIONS.  Sets the amount of the employer contribution to the Hawaii employer-union health benefits trust fund as a fixed percentage of the health benefits plan or life insurance plan premium cost. Makes conforming amendments to remove the amount of contributions by the State and counties to the Hawaii employer-union health benefits trust fund from the scope of collective bargaining negotiations.	LGO, FIN
HB 413 Status	RELATING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN RESOURCES DEVELOPMENT.  Appropriates funds for the department of human resources development to retain the services of an online employment marketplace or networking platform to assist in recruiting employees for the State.	LGO, FIN

HB 542 RELATING TO PROCUREMENT. LGO, JHA

Status Allows bidders to clarify or correct immaterial or technical information

required as part of a bid submission for up to twenty-four hours after the bid submission deadline, in addition to the time for correction or withdrawal of inadvertently erroneous bids before or after the award as permitted by rules adopted by the procurement policy board. Requires that bids for construction be opened no sooner than twenty-four hours after the deadline for the submission of bids. Defines "immaterial or

technical information". Repeals 6/30/2028.

RELATING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN RESOURCES LGO, FIN HB 564

Status DEVELOPMENT.

> Appropriates moneys to the Department of Human Resources Development to establish 2.0 full-time equivalent information technology specialist positions and upgrade information technology systems, including network upgrades; purchase and installation of desktop computers, workstations, and laptops; and training for

personnel.

RELATING TO ADMINISTRATIVE RULEMAKING. LGO, JHA HB 572

Requires that prior to the adoption, amendment, or repeal of an <u>Status</u>

> administrative rule, electronic notice of the proposed rulemaking be provided to all persons who have made a timely written request of the adopting agency for advance notice of its rulemaking proceedings.

RELATING TO COLLECTIVE BARGAINING. LGO, HET, FIN HB 874

Status Establishes a collective bargaining unit for graduate assistants

employed by the University of Hawaii and community college system.

HB 491 RELATING TO A LEAVE GRANT PROGRAM. LGO, ECD, FIN

Status Establishes within the Department of Business, Economic Development, and Tourism a leave grant program to help small

businesses offer their paid family leave and sick leave. Appropriates

moneys.
