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SB 193, SD1 RELATING TO THE STATE FIRE COUNCIL. LGO, WAL (SSCR970) Adds to the membership of the State Fire Council, and to the membership of advisory committees that the Council may appoint,

representatives from the Hawaii State Aircraft Rescue Fire Fighting Unit and the Division of Forestry and Wildlife of the Department of Land and Natural Resources to reflect all non-federal fire fighting

agencies in the State. (SD1)

SB 360, SD2 RELATING TO FAMILY LEAVE. LGO, CPC, FIN

(SSCR917) Requires the Department of Labor and Industrial Relations, in consultation with the Insurance Commissioner, to develop a procedural

manual to implement a family leave insurance program that pays family leave insurance benefits. Appropriates funds. Effective

1/1/2050. (SD2)

SB 435, SD1 (SSCR1075) Status	RELATING TO PUBLIC WORKS. Imposes the penalty on both the person and the firm upon the finding of repeat violations of the state law governing wages and hours of employees on public works. Requires each notice of violation to contain the names of the person and the firm. Makes conforming amendments. Effective 1/1/2050. (SD1)	LGO, JHA, FIN
SB 576, SD3 (SSCR941) Status	RELATING TO GOVERNMENT. Requires reports of official out-of-state and intra-state travel by state employees, officers, or other representatives of state departments or agencies, including the Judiciary and University of Hawaii, to be made available for public review on the Comptroller's website. Appropriates moneys. Effective 7/1/2112. (SD3)	LGO, FIN
SB 811, SD2 (SSCR924) Status	RELATING TO DEMOGRAPHIC DATA. Requires state agencies to disaggregate data consistent with federal standards and requires publication of the data. Establishes a task force to assess demographic data collection, processing, retention, and sharing procedures, needs, and challenges. Requires a report to the Legislature. Effective 7/1/2112. (SD2)	LGO, FIN
SB 1082, SD2 (SSCR984) Status	RELATING TO PUBLIC PARKING SPACES. Effective January 1, 2025, requires all State- and privately-owned parking lots in the State that contain public paid parking spaces to accept payment of parking fees by credit card and debit card. Requires all State- and privately-owned parking meters in the State that collect parking fees for any public paid parking space to be maintained in working order to accept payment by credit card and debit card. Requires the Department of Accounting and General Services and the counties to submit reports to the Legislature. Defines motor vehicle, public parking space, and parking meter. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2)	LGO, FIN
SB 1135 (SSCR798) Status	RELATING TO PROCUREMENT. Requires cash or protest bonds to be returned to the initiating parties, minus administrative costs, except in cases where the appeal was frivolous or made in bad faith.	LGO, FIN

DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW

Persons wishing to offer comments should submit testimony at least 24 hours prior to the hearing.
