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<u>SB 306, SD1</u> (<u>SSCR1096)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO PUBLIC INFORMATION. Requires all state agencies adopting, amending, or repealing a rule to make the full text of the rules of the agency available on the Office of the Lieutenant Governor's internet website in a digitally accessible and searchable format. Requires a report to the Legislature. Appropriates funds. Effective 7/1/2112. (SD1)	LGO, FIN
<u>SB 1129, SD2</u> (<u>SSCR956)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO PROCUREMENT. Raises the procurement threshold for small purchases to \$50,000. Effective 7/1/2112. (SD2)	LGO, FIN
<u>SB 1138</u> (SSCR844) <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO PROCUREMENT. Prohibits a procurement officer from disclosing a competing offeror's proposal or evaluation score during a debriefing requested by a non- selected offeror. Authorizes the disclosure of a competing offeror's proposal or evaluation score after a protest is resolved and the contract is executed.	LGO, FIN



<u>SB 1383, SD1</u> (<u>SSCR404)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE HAWAII EMPLOYMENT SECURITY LAW. Creates the Unemployment Insurance Technology Special Fund that will be funded by an additional assessment of .01 per cent to Unemployment Compensation Trust Fund contributions to support the information technology operating and maintenance expenses for the payment of benefits and contributions under Hawaii's Employment Security Law. Effective 1/1/2050. (SD1)	LGO, FIN
SB 415, SD2	RELATING TO WAGES.	LGO, JHA
(SSCR793) Status	Makes general contractors entering into or under contracts in the State for work on buildings, structures, or other private works liable for debt incurred by subcontractors for wages due to claimants for performance of labor in the contract between the general contractor and owner. Effective 7/1/2112. (SD2)	,
<u>SB 814, SD2</u> (<u>SSCR926)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO ELECTRONIC INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY ACCESSIBILITY FOR PERSONS WITH LIMITED ENGLISH PROFICIENCY. Requires the Office of Enterprise Technology Services, in consultation with the Office of Language Access and a working group comprising stakeholders, to develop and publish, and periodically review and update, electronic information technology multilingual accessibility standards to be implemented by all state entities. Appropriates funds for one full-time equivalent (1.00 FTE) position. Effective 7/1/2112. (SD2)	LGO, FIN
