SB 299, SD2 (SSCR659) Status	RELATING TO BUDGET-RELATED SUBMISSIONS TO THE LEGISLATURE. Authorizes the Legislature to specify the form in which the proposed budgets of the executive branch, judiciary branch, and Office of Hawaiian Affairs are submitted to the Legislature. Requires the executive branch, judiciary branch, and Office of Hawaiian Affairs to conform no later than 12/1/2023. (SD2)	LGO, FIN
SB 1196, SD1 (SSCR843) Status	RELATING TO BOARDS AND COMMISSIONS. Clarifies that board and commission holdover members shall not hold office beyond the end of the second regular legislative session following the expiration of the member's term of office regardless of any conflicting statutes. SB 1518, SD2, HD1 (HSCR1292) Status	RELATING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION. Provides procurement exemptions for the Department of Education for certain goods, services, and construction. Effective 6/30/3000. Sunsets 6/30/2026. (HD1)	EDN, LGO, FIN
SB 1509, SD2 (SSCR962) Status	RELATING TO THE STATE ARCHIVES. Establishes additional funding sources for, and authorizes additional expenditures of moneys in, the state archives preservation and long-term access special fund. Appropriates funds. Effective 7/1/2112. (SD2)	LGO, FIN

SB 722, SD2 (SSCR938) Status	RELATING TO OCCUPATIONAL SAFETY AND HEALTH. Establishes the workforce safety and health special fund. Directs certain fees and penalties to be deposited into the special fund. Effective 1/1/2050. (SD2)	LGO, FIN
SB 725, SD2 (SSCR1059) Status	RELATING TO TELEWORKING. Requires and appropriates moneys for the Department of Human Resources Development to submit an annual report to the Legislature on the telework policies of the executive branch. Establishes requirements and appropriates moneys for a telework monitoring system to assess the productivity of telework employees. Effective 1/1/2050. (SD2)	LGO, FIN
