RELATING TO THE PUBLIC LITILITIES COMMISSION

TCA CPN

Status & Testimony	Removes requirement that common water carriers receive permission from the public utilities commission prior to executing a long-term lease of more than three years or a leverage lease.	TCA, CPN
SB 517 Status & Testimony	RELATING TO MOTORCYCLES. Authorizes operators of motorcycles to utilize the lane shoulders that are at least three feet wide with the concurrent use of emergency flashers. Requires the Department of Transportation to create and implement traffic control devices to designate the lane shoulder for motorcycle use during peak traffic hours.	TCA, JDC/WAM
SB 973 Status & Testimony	RELATING TO TRANSPORTATION. Requires lessors of rental motor vehicles to incorporate zero-emission vehicles or plug-in hybrid electric vehicles, or both, into the lessor's rental motor vehicle fleets.	TCA, CPN
SB 382 Status & Testimony	RELATING TO MOTOR VEHICLES. Prohibits motor vehicle manufacturers from charging subscription fees for services that employ equipment already installed in the motor vehicle at the time of sale as a new motor vehicle.	TCA, CPN

SB 493 Status & Testimony

RELATING TO MOTOR VEHICLE INSPECTIONS.

TCA, WAM

Provides that no new vehicle needs a safety inspection until five years after the date the vehicle was first sold, unless the vehicle was modified. Requires a two-year motor vehicle safety check for vehicles ten years of age or newer, unless the vehicle was modified. Requires an annual motor vehicle safety check for vehicles older than ten years of age or any vehicle that has been modified. Doubles the inspection fee for the two-year motor vehicles inspection safety check.
