SB 965, SD2 (SSCR1068) Status

RELATING TO GREEN TRANSPORTATION INFRASTRUCTURE.

TRN/EEP, FIN

Establishes green infrastructure objectives and policies for transportation systems, infrastructure, and projects. Establishes the green transportation infrastructure task force to examine, evaluate, and develop policies for the design, implementation, and maintenance of green transportation infrastructure. Effective 7/1/2050 and 6/30/2052. (SD2)



SB 1024, SD2 (SSCR758) Status

### RELATING TO TRANSPORTATION.

TRN/EEP, FIN

Establishes long-term goals for zero-emissions transportation in Hawaii and abroad to reduce and eliminate transportation emissions. Establishes the clean ground transportation working group and the interisland and transpacific clean transportation working group. Requires annual reports to the Hawaii climate change mitigation and adaptation commission and the legislature. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2)

#### **DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW**
