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| <u>SB 70</u> Status & Testimony | RELATING TO THE CONSERVATION AND RESOURCES ENFORCEMENT PROGRAM. Requires the Department of Land and Natural Resources to pursue and obtain accreditation for the Conservation and Resources Enforcement Program from the Commission on Accreditation for Law Enforcement Agencies, Inc. Appropriates funds. | WTL, WAM |

| <u>SB 81</u> Status & Testimony | RELATING TO NATURAL RESOURCE MANAGEMENT. Clarifies that the Board of Land and Natural Resources' authority shall supersede the Mauna Kea Stewardship and Oversight Authority for all lands designated under the state conservation district. | WTL, JDC/WAM |

| SE 69 Status & Testimony | RELATING TO COASTAL ZONE MANAGEMENT. Includes the establishment of a consistent and balanced framework for developing and implementing sea level rise adaptation strategies as an objective of the Coastal Zone Management Program. Includes the promotion of research, study, and understanding of the suitability and impacts of different sea level rise adaptation as a policy of the Coastal Zone Management Program. Includes the maintenance of a balance between public and private interests in implementing sea level rise adaptation and consideration of all appropriate sea level rise adaptations as policies of the Coastal Zone Management Program. Includes as a policy of the Coastal Zone Management Program. Includes as a policy of the Coastal Zone Management Program that any construction on shoreline be allowed if it is determined to preserve, protect, or rehabilitate the beach of be considered vital development. Requires the County Planning Commission to allow proposed development within the shoreline area and within the sea level rise exposure area under certain circumstances. Prohibits any policy or guideline for setting special area use permit application procedures that has the effect of a rule without complying with the rulemaking process. Preempts any rule, policy, or guideline inconsistent with the Special Management Area Guidelines. Allows counties to require that shoreline setback lines be established at greater distances in certain circumstances. Provides that no variance be denied for maintenance, renovation, or repair of a lawful nonconforming structure with exceptions. | WTL, WAM/JDC |
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| <u>SB 89</u> <u>Status &</u> <u>Testimony</u> | RELATING TO MARINE MANAGEMENT AREAS. Requires the Department of Land and Natural Resources to comply with chapter 91, Hawaii Revised Statutes, when designating marine management areas. | WTL, JDC |
| <u>SB 92</u> Status & Testimony | RELATING TO COMMUNITY-BASED SUBSISTENCE FISHING AREAS. Establishes a time limitation for community-based subsistence fishing area designations; provided that the Department of Land and Natural Resources may consider extending a designation in the year prior to the designation's expiration unless the designation is made through statute before its expiration. | WTL, JDC/WAM |
| <u>SB 94</u> Status & Testimony | RELATING TO SPECIAL ACTIVITY PERMITS. Requires the Department of Land and Natural Resources to approve or deny an application for a special activity permit for aquatic research within ninety days from the date that it was submitted. | WTL, JDC |
| <u>SB 98</u> <u>Status &</u> <u>Testimony</u> | RELATING TO WILDLIFE MANAGEMENT. Requires the Auditor to audit the Department of Land and Natural Resources' Aquatic Resources Division's expenditures of funds received from the federal Wildlife and Sport Fish Restoration program. Requires a report to the Legislature. | WTL, WAM |
| <u>SB 730</u> Status & Testimony | RELATING TO FISHPONDS. Appropriates funds to support the Department of Land and Natural Resources in restoring and restocking fishponds. | WTL, WAM |
