<u>SB 1389</u> <u>Status &</u> <u>Testimony</u>	RELATING TO REAL PROPERTY DISCLOSURES WITHIN SHORELINE AREAS. Requires mandatory disclosure of all existing permitted and unpermitted shoreline erosion control structures, the annual erosion rate, and the current actual setback of all structures for shoreline properties prior to real estate transactions.	WTL, CPN
<u>SB 1095</u> <u>Status &</u> <u>Testimony</u>	RELATING TO COASTAL ZONE MANAGEMENT. Amends the definition of "development" to create additional exceptions, including pedestrian or bicycle facilities, trash removal, invasive vegetation control, installation of fencing for invasive species control or native habitat preservation, removal of access devices for inspection and maintenance of utilities, and lighting fixtures at existing public recreation facilities.	WTL, JDC
<u>SB 1068</u> <u>Status &</u> <u>Testimony</u>	RELATING TO BEACHES. Includes in the State's policies for the physical environment under the Hawaii State Planning Act, the development of a statewide beach assessment study and a beach and shoreline restoration and conservation plan. Appropriates funds.	WTL, WAM

<u>SB 417</u> <u>Status &</u> <u>Testimony</u>	RELATING TO CORAL REEF ECOSYSTEMS. Establishes a Hawaii Near Shore Waters Quality Program to monitor and test for the quality of waters near coral reefs to assess and ensure health of reef ecosystems. Appropriates funds.	WTL, WAM
<u>SB 1028</u> Status & Testimony	RELATING TO VESSELS. Beginning 1/1/2024, requires rental kayaks to be registered and numbered with the department of land and natural resources and have the identification number affixed to the rental kayak. Requires the department to establish fees for registration and registration renewal of rental kayaks.	WTL, CPN/WAM
<u>SB 1265</u> Status & Testimony	RELATING TO KANEOHE BAY. Prohibits commercial ocean use activity in Kaneohe Bay waters without a permit. Prohibits any person from advertising any commercial ocean use activity in Kaneohe Bay waters for which the person does not have a permit, lease, or license.	WTL, CPN/WAM
SB 1388 Status & Testimony	RELATING TO OCEAN RECREATION COMMERCIAL PERMITS. Specifies the methods by which the Department of Land and Natural Resources can issue new ocean recreation commercial permits and renew existing ocean recreation commercial permits. Specifies that new permits for ocean recreation management areas and facilities where a permit limit is implemented, new permits will be issued by the method enumerated and in the order set forth herein until the limit is reached. For renewal of existing permits in ocean recreation management areas and facilities where a permit limit is implemented, the ability to renew a commercial permit will be based on seniority until the limit is reached.	WTL, JDC/WAM
SB 97 Status & Testimony	RELATING TO PUBLIC LANDS. Clarifies that the Board of Land and Natural Resources shall not unilaterally amend the terms and conditions of any lease of public lands being extended pursuant to Act 149, Session Laws of Hawaii 2018, except as otherwise provided therein; and if the Board of Land and Natural Resources wishes to amend the terms and conditions of any lease of public lands being extended to reflect the Board's most current lease form and leasing practices and policies, such lease form and leasing practices and policies must be included in the rules of the Board. Defines "lease of public lands". Repeals 6/30/2028.	WTL, JDC/WAM
SB 79 Status & Testimony	RELATING TO PUBLIC LANDS. Repeals the requirement for Board of Land and Natural Resources approval for lease extensions in the Hilo Community Economic District. Requires the Department of Land and Natural Resources to use the current tax assessed value when offering lease extensions to lessees. Requires all applications to the Department of Land and Natural Resources for an extension of fixed rental periods or lease terms to be made within 180 days and confirm lease extensions.	WTL, JDC/WAM

SB 82RELATING TO THE BOARD OF LAND AND NATURAL
RESOURCES.
Limits the discretion of the Department of Land and Natural
Resources' Land Division by requiring the Board of Land and
Natural Resources to approve all revoked, limited, condemned,
removed, or modified public land leases or revocable permits.
