HB671 RELATING TO OHANA ZONES.

HSG, FIN

Appropriates funds for the ohana zones pilot program, including expenses relating to operations, upkeep of facilities, provision of services, and administrative costs. Authorizes the issuance of general obligation bonds for the construction of facilities for the ohana zones pilot program.

HB672 RELATING TO HOUSING CAPACITY.

HSG, WAL, FIN

Requires each county to adopt reasonable standards to allow the construction of up to four dwelling units on any land with an urban state land use district classification that is zoned for residential use where a single-family dwelling unit is permitted.

HB673 RELATING TO HOUSING.

HSG, WAL, FIN

Authorizes the counties to reclassify lands fifteen to one hundred acres in certain rural, urban, and agricultural districts in which at least fifty per cent of the housing units on the land sought to be reclassified are set aside for persons and families with incomes at or below one hundred forty per cent of the area median income.

<u>HB678</u>	RELATING TO HOUSING. Clarifies a county's obligations with respect to housing developed through the housing development programs overseen by the Hawaii housing finance and development corporation. Sunsets 7/1/2031.	HSG, FIN
<u>HB679</u>	RELATING TO STATE FUNDS.  Amends the general fund appropriation for the Hawaii housing finance and development corporation in Act 236, SLH 2022, to help the State meet its American Rescue Plan Act maintenance of effort obligations.	HSG, FIN

**Committee** REFERRAL HB681 RELATING TO STATE BUILDING CODES. HSG, CPC, FIN Exempts any code with an official publication date within four years of the prior code publication date from certain adoption requirements. HB682 RELATING TO INCOME TAX CREDITS FOR TRN, FIN RIDESHARING. Provides a carpooling income tax credit for qualified commuters. RELATED TO DRIVING UNDER THE INFLUENCE OF AN HB683 TRN, JHA, FIN INTOXICANT. Establishes a penalty of child support costs for motorists who operate a motor vehicle under the influence of an intoxicant and in the process kill the parent of a minor child. RELATING TO EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT. HB684 WAL, JHA, FIN Amends chapter 127A, Hawaii Revised Statutes (HRS), to clarify State and local authority, ensure effective and adaptable emergency response, and further the goals of transparency and democratic accountability. Clarifies that powers granted for emergency purposes shall not be construed as permitting actions inconsistent with the state constitution. Amends chapter 127A, HRS, to provide for greater clarity and specificity regarding the scope of suspensions of law. Clarifies that Hawaii's emergency management system includes coordination between State and county emergency management functions, where appropriate. Clarifies the legal framework governing the extension and termination of emergency periods. Adds the definition of the term "severe weather warning" as used in section 127A-30, HRS. RELATING TO ABORTION. HLT/JHA HB685 Prohibits the abortion of a fetus that contains a fetal heartbeat. Provides certain exceptions. Establishes penalties. RELATING TO FIREWORKS. HB686 TRN, CPC, FIN Authorizes Department of Public Safety to inspect shipping containers for illegal fireworks and explosives. Establishes a shipping container inspection program using X-ray scanning portals and associated special fund. Authorizes Department of Transportation to impose shipping container import fees. Increases fine and punishment for fireworks violations.

<u>HB694</u>	RELATING TO THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII.  Appropriates funds to support the aquaculture disease diagnostic laboratory at the University of Hawaii college of tropical agriculture and human resources, in partnership with the Hawaii department of agriculture.	HET, FIN
<u>HB695</u>	RELATING TO FENCES. Allows the use of battery-charged security fences under certain circumstances.	AGR, CPC

HB696 RELATING TO MEDICAL CANNABIS DISPENSARIES. HLT, CPC, FIN

Establishes system access and system integration requirements for the computer software tracking system for medical cannabis dispensaries. Requires the department of health to submit an annual report to the legislature on data captured using the computer software tracking system.

RELATING TO FEDERAL LANDS. HB697

CMV/WAL, JHA,

Establishes within the department of land and natural resources a FIN Makua valley task force to prepare for the transition of the management of the Makua military reservation from the United States Army upon the expiration of the Army's lease for the land. Requires a report to the legislature.

RELATING TO THE TRANSFER OF NON-AGRICULTURAL WAL/AGR, JHA, **HB698** PARK LANDS.

Exempts easements granted over public lands affecting the transfer of public lands between DLNR and DOA from formal county subdivision process and approval requirements. Requires the DOA to accept the transfer of and manage certain qualifying non-agricultural park lands. Requires the DOA, prior to offering a lease, to inquire with the DLNR regarding any easements required for access to landlocked forest reserves or other assets on the lands subject to the lease. Requires the lessee to develop a conservation program and plan if conservation resources exist on the land. Before the transfer of non-agricultural park lands, authorizes the DOA to request information from the DLNR related to the establishment of necessary and reasonable easements upon the lands. Requires approval from the board of land and natural resources and the board of agriculture before removing pasture lands for reforestation, or other public purposes.

RELATING TO ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT HB699

STATEMENTS.

Exempts the proposed drilling, construction, or use of a well and well appurtenances on lands leased from the Department of Agriculture from the requirements of the environmental impact statements law, provided that the land is being used to support agriculture and food production.

**HB700** RELATING TO THE FUEL TAX. ECD, FIN

Suspends the state fuel tax for the period of July 1, 2023, to June 30, 2024.

WAL, FIN

Appropriates funds to dredge the boat ramp at Pohoiki bay, Puna.

RELATING TO POHOIKI BOAT RAMP.

#### REFERRAL **HB702** RELATING TO STATE PARKS. WAL, FIN Requires the Department of Land and Natural Resources to conduct a study of the carrying capacity of Makena State Park in the County of Maui. Appropriates moneys. HB703 RELATING TO FUGITIVE DUST CONTROL. HLT, JHA Prohibits owners of vacant undeveloped land to cause or permit visible fugitive dust to become airborne from their land or to cause or permit visible fugitive dust that originates from their vacant developed land to be discharged beyond their land's lot line. Requires owners of vacant undeveloped land to submit to the Department of Health a Fugitive Dust Mitigation Plan no later than December 31, 2023, and every three years thereafter, and obtain approval from the Director of Health. Requires the Department of Health to adopt rules and submit reports to the Legislature. RELATING TO MOTOR VEHICLE REGISTRATION. TRN. CPC **HB704** Provides an exemption for flatbed trucks from registration renewals and initial registrations of motor carrier vehicles when used as marine terminal equipment temporarily moving in or between certain terminals. Adds new terminal locales and roadways to be covered under the exemption. HB705 RELATING TO LEGISLATIVE ALLOWANCE. JHA Requires each house of the legislature to post a report of the legislative allowance expenditures for each member of the respective house on the legislature's website. HB706 RELATING TO FINANCIAL DISCLOSURES. JHA Requires all members of the legislature to disclose certain relationships with lobbyists or lobbying organizations in their financial disclosures. JHA HB707 RELATING TO FALSE CLAIMS. Makes it a class C felony to make false, fictitious, or fraudulent claims against the State or a county, or any of their departments or agencies. Disqualifies a person from holding elective public office for a period of ten years upon conviction of making a false, fictitious, or fraudulent claim.

#### **HB708** RELATING TO LOBBYISTS. JHA Amends the information in the statement of expenditures reports that lobbyists and other individuals are required to file with the Hawaii state ethics commission to include the identity, by bill number, resolution number, or other similar identifier, of the legislative or administrative action that was commented on, supported by, or opposed by the person filing the statement. HB709 RELATING TO MANDATORY LOBBYIST TRAINING. JHA Requires a lobbyist training course to be designed and administered by the state ethics commission. Makes the lobbyist training course mandatory for all lobbyists who are required to register and renew their registration with the state ethics commission. Imposes administrative fines for violations. Effective 7/1/2024. **HB710** RELATING TO GOVERNMENT. JHA Establishes the class C felony offense of using or making false statements or entries in matters within the jurisdiction of the executive, legislative, or judicial branch of the State, or any county. Disqualifies a person from holding elective public office for a period of ten years upon conviction of making a false statement or entry. HB711 RELATING TO FRAUD. JHA Establishes the offense of fraud as a class B felony. Disqualifies a person from holding elective public office for a period of ten years upon conviction of fraud. HB712 RELATING TO RECORDINGS OF PUBLIC MEETINGS. JHA Encourages boards to maintain any electronic audio or visual recording of a board meeting as a public record on the board's website regardless of whether the written minutes of the meeting have been posted. Amends the information that must be included as part of the written minutes of board meetings. Requires boards to provide the state archives with a copy of any electronic audio or visual recording of a board meeting before removing the recording from the board's website. Effective 10/1/2023. RELATING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF HAWAIIAN **HSG** HB713 HOMELANDS. Short form bill relating to the department of Hawaiian

#### **Committee** REFERRAL **HB714** RELATING TO MOORING LINES. TRN, CPC Requires commodities and manifested cargo requiring tug assistance to be manned by an existing, operational stevedoring company that is operating within the State. HB715 RELATING TO GIFTS FROM LOBBYISTS. JHA Prohibits lobbyists from making prohibited gifts to legislators and state employees. Imposes administrative fines for violations. RELATING TO ELECTIONS. JHA, FIN **HB716** Requires the office of elections to prepare a voter information guide that includes candidate statements and statements on ballot questions. Appropriates funds to the department of the attorney general, legislative reference bureau, and counties for the preparation of the ballot analyses. Appropriates funds to the office of elections for the preparation and distribution of the voter information guides. HB717 RELATING TO NEPOTISM. JHA Beginning 7/1/2023, prohibits under certain circumstances legislators and state employees from hiring or promoting relatives and household members and from making or participating in certain other employment-related decisions and from awarding a contract to or otherwise taking official action on a contract with a business if the legislator's or employee's relative or household member is an executive officer of or holds a substantial ownership interest in that business. Imposes administrative fines for violations. RELATING TO PRELIMINARY DETERMINATION OF **HB718** JHA PROBABLE CAUSE. Requires the campaign spending commission to serve preliminary determinations of probable cause via first-class mail, instead of certified mail. Establishes a presumption of receipt when the preliminary determination is mailed to the address contained in a candidate or committee organizational report. HB719 RELATING TO PUBLIC RECORDS. JHA, FIN Beginning 7/1/2024, imposes a cap on charges for the reproduction of certain government records; waives the cost of duplication of government records provided to requestors in an electronic format; imposes a cap on charges for searching for, reviewing, and segregating records; and provides for a waiver of fees when the public interest is served by a record's disclosure. Appropriates funds for positions in the office of information

practices.

### HB720 RELATING TO PARTIAL PUBLIC FINANCING OF ELECTIONS.

JHA. FIN

Increases the amount of partial public financing available for all offices. Increases the maximum amount of public funds available for all offices by fifty per cent. Increases the maximum amount of public funds available for a candidate for OHA from \$1,500 to ten per cent of the expenditure limit established by statute for each election. Increases the amounts of qualifying contributions for OHA from more than \$1,500 in the aggregate to more than \$5,000 in the aggregate. Provides a downward adjustment of the minimum amounts of qualifying contributions for the office of prosecuting attorney for the city and county of Honolulu, and counties of Hawaii and Kauai, and for the office of county council for the county of Maui. Establishes two full-time equivalent (2.0 FTE) positions in the campaign spending commission. Appropriates funds.

### HB721 RELATING TO CANDIDATE COMMITTEE

JHA

EXPENDITURES.

Eliminates the use of campaign funds to purchase up to two tickets for an event or fundraiser held by another candidate or committee.

### HB722 RELATING TO CANDIDATE COMMITTEE AND NONCANDIDATE COMMITTEE FUNDRAISERS.

JHA

Amends the definition of "fundraiser" under the election law relating to the notice of intent for fundraisers and fundraising events.

#### <u>HB723</u> RELATING TO THE SUNSHINE LAW.

JHA

Expands application of the State's sunshine law to legislatively appointed bodies, including task forces, working groups, special committees, and select committees. Requires the senate and the house of representatives to hold public hearings on a biennial basis to solicit professional and public feedback on how chamber rules can better effectuate the intent of the State's sunshine law.

#### HB724 RELATING TO CAMPAIGN CONTRIBUTIONS.

JHA

Amends the prohibition against contributions to a candidate committee or noncandidate committee by state and county contractors to include state and county grantees and the owners, officers, and immediate family members of a state or county contractor or state or county grantee.

#### **Committee** REFERRAL HB725 RELATING TO THE LEGISLATURE. JHA, FIN Establishes the office of the public advocate. Establishes rights for members of the public with respect to the conduct and operation of the legislature and its members. Specifies procedures for the investigation and reporting of alleged violations of the rights. RELATING TO CAMPAIGN CONTRIBUTIONS. JHA **HB726** Prohibits state and county elected officials from soliciting and accepting campaign contributions during any regular session or special session of the state legislature, including any extension of any regular session or special session and any legislative recess days, holidays, and weekends. RELATING TO CAMPAIGN FUNDS. JHA HB727 Limits the permitted uses of campaign funds to only those purposes that are directly related to the campaigns of candidates. MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR COUNTY ETHICS. **HB728** JHA, FIN Provides grants in aid to several counties' boards of ethics. HB729 RELATING TO CANDIDATE COMMITTEE AND JHA NONCANDIDATE COMMITTEE ORGANIZATIONAL REPORTS. Requires the campaign spending commission to publish on its website the names of candidate committees and noncandidate committees who fail to properly file an organizational report. RELATING TO CAMPAIGN SPENDING CASH JHA HB730 CONTRIBUTIONS. Limits the amount of cash contributions a candidate, candidate committee, or noncandidate committee can accept in the aggregate in an election period to \$100. Requires receipts for each contribution. RELATING TO CAMPAIGN SPENDING COMMISSION HB731 JHA ORDERS. Provides that a person waives the right to a contested case hearing if the person fails to request a contested case hearing within twenty days of receipt of the commission's preliminary determination. Provides that a final order of the commission may be filed in the circuit court of the first circuit for confirmation as a civil judgment, enforceable and collectible as any other judgment issued in the circuit courts.

#### **Committee** REFERRAL **HB732** RELATING TO COMPLAINTS ALLEGING VIOLATIONS JHA OF CAMPAIGN SPENDING LAWS. Allows the campaign spending commission to presume a violation of campaign spending laws has occurred if a respondent fails to explain or otherwise respond to a complaint alleging a campaign spending violation. RELATING TO VIOLATIONS OF CAMPAIGN FINANCE JHA HB733 LAW. Increases the amount of the fine for campaign spending law violations that may be assessed against a noncandidate committee making only independent expenditures and that has received at least one contribution of more than \$10,000, or spent more than \$10,000, in an election period. Allows the campaign spending commission to order that the payment of a fine assessed against a noncandidate committee, or any portion thereof, be paid from the personal funds of an officer of the noncandidate committee. **HB734** RELATING TO CANNABIS. HLT, JHA Amends the Hawaii Revised Statutes to replace the word "marijuana" and related terms with the term "cannabis" or related terms, as appropriate. HB735 RELATING TO AN INTERSTATE COMPACT TO PHASE ECD, CPC, FIN OUT CORPORATE WELFARE. Adopts the Interstate Compact to Phase Out Corporate Welfare. RELATING TO GENDER EQUITY. JHA, FIN HB736 Appropriates funds for the Department of Human Resources to contract for a study on the gender pay gap within the government of the State. Requires a report to the Legislature. RELATING TO RECIDIVISM REDUCTION. CMV, JHA HB737 Authorizes the Hawaii paroling authority to award credits to parolees for compliance with the terms and conditions of parole supervision that accordingly reduce the overall term of parole supervision. RELATING TO REEF PROTECTION. **HB738** WAL, CPC Prohibits commercial operators of surfing tourism, instruction, and lesson companies from providing, or allowing the wearing of, footwear during lessons taking place on or above certain submerged reefs.

HUS, FIN

HB739 RELATING TO MOTOR VEHICLE SAFETY INSPECTIONS.

Requires the Department of Transportation to amend its administrative rules to repeal any provisions requiring the furnishing of evidence of registration as a condition precedent to receiving a certificate of inspection.

<u>HB740</u> RELATING TO THE SUPPLEMENTAL NUTRITION

ASSISTANCE PROGRAM.

Establishes an additional minimum Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) benefit of \$250 per month per person for SNAP-eligible households whose income is below two hundred per cent of the federal poverty level, as established by the United States Department of Agriculture. Requires that SNAP-eligible households whose monthly income exceeds two hundred per cent of the federal poverty level receive a graduated decline of additional SNAP benefits. Requires state general funds to be used to supplement the cost of the additional benefits. Appropriates funds.

HB741 RELATING TO CIVIC EDUCATION.

EDN, FIN

JHA. FIN

Appropriates funds to the department of education for the expansion of civic education in the public schools. Establishes two full-time equivalent permanent civic education resource teacher positions, one of which shall be grant funded.

HB742 PROPOSING AN AMENDMENT TO THE CONSTITUTION

OF THE STATE OF HAWAII TO AMEND THE

QUALIFYING AGE OF VOTERS FOR ANY STATE OR

LOCAL ELECTION.

Proposes a constitutional amendment to lower the qualifying age of voters for any state or local election to sixteen years of age.

HB743 RELATING TO EDUCATION.

EDN, FIN

Requires the department of education to establish an electric school bus pilot program to provide certain complex areas with ownership and control of electric school buses. Appropriates

funds.

HB744 RELATING TO BOOSTER CLUBS.

EDN, FIN

Requires school booster clubs to be audited by the department of education's internal audit office or department of accounting and general services on a regular basis. Requires the audited school

booster club to reimburse the costs of the audit.

#### HB745 RELATING TO EQUAL PAY.

LGO, JHA, FIN

Conforms statutory prohibitions against wage discrimination with other prohibitions on employment discrimination. Clarifies allowable justifications for compensation differentials and remedies for pay disparity. Requires employers to disclose wage ranges to employees and prospective employees. Exempts wage disclosure and discussion from the prohibitions on employer retaliation or discrimination if knowledge of the wages stems from human resources, payroll, or legal professional responsibilities in the workplace.

#### HB746 RELATING TO AQUACULTURE.

AGR. FIN

Transfers the rights, powers, functions, and duties of the department of agriculture plant industry division relating to the State's aquaculture program to the animal industry division.

#### <u>HB747</u> RELATING TO CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS FOR FIN

THE BENEFIT OF THE FORTY-SIXTH REPRESENTATIVE

DISTRICT.

Appropriates funds for capital improvement projects in the forty-sixth representative district.

#### <u>HB748</u> RELATING TO ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION.

EEP, CPC, FIN

Beginning 12/31/2026, prohibits the manufacture, sale, offer for sale, distribution for sale, and distribution for use of any food packaging, food service ware, cosmetic, or personal care product that contains perfluoroalkyl and polyfluoroalkyl substances.

#### HB749 RELATING TO ENVIRONMENTAL ASSESSMENTS.

WAL, JHA

Removes historic sites and the Waikiki special district from the requirement for environmental assessments under section 343-5,

HRS.

#### HB750 RELATING TO DAM AND APPURTENANCE SAFETY.

WAL, FIN

Establishes the dam and appurtenance loan and grant programs for plans, design, construction, and equipment that is used to improve deficient dams and appurtenances as determined by the Department of Land and Natural Resources and approved by the Board of Land and Natural Resources. Specifies eligibility requirements for dam and appurtenance improvement grants. Establishes the dam and appurtenance improvement tax credit for expenditures for dam and appurtenance improvements that bring dams and appurtenances up to code. Appropriates funds.

#### REFERRAL HB751 RELATING TO JURORS. JHA Clarifies that a prospective juror is disqualified to serve as a juror if they have been convicted of a felony and have not been finally discharged, in addition to not being pardoned. HB752 RELATING TO PROTECTIVE ORDERS. JHA Allows nonresidents to apply for a temporary restraining order or order for protection in cases of domestic abuse. Allows nonresidents to apply for a temporary restraining order and an injunction from further harassment. RELATING TO AN INCOME TAX CREDIT. HB753 HSG, CPC, FIN Establishes a nonrefundable individual income tax credit for expenses paid to retrofit a residence with wind resistive devices. RELATING TO THE STATE HISTORIC PRESERVATION HB754 WAL, FIN DIVISION. Appropriates funds to the department of land and natural resources' state historic preservation division for a library digitization process and for the division's operations. HB755 RELATING TO AQUATIC NUISANCE SPECIES. Allows the counties to adopt a county building code for single-family dwellings, additional dwellings, duplexes, and non-commercial structures that is distinct from the Hawaii state building codes.

Establishes the Environmental Crimes Unit within the Office of the Attorney General. Requires counties with a private activity bond issuance program to exhaust their allotment before applying to the State for the state allocation. Requires a project to first apply to the county in which the project is located, if the county has a private activity bond issuance program, before applying to the State. Requires the State, if it receives a county allocation, to award that same amount to benefit that county. Requires the department of budget and finance to indicate to the Hawaii housing finance and development corporation any county amount of unused or unassigned allocation. Effective 7/2/2023.

Provides that criminal history record checks may be conducted by county police departments on applicants for licenses to carry a pistol or revolver and ammunition pursuant to section 134-9, HRS.

Amends chapter 138, Hawaii Revised Statutes, to add the director of the Department of Law Enforcement or the director's designee as a member of the Enhanced 911 Board.

HB1041 RELATING TO FIREWORKS.

JHA, FIN

Establishes the Illegal Fireworks Task Force within the Department of Law Enforcement to plan, coordinate, and engage in law enforcement operations to interdict illegal fireworks, develop a comprehensive strategic plan to stop the importation of illegal fireworks and explosives into the State, promote compliance with the fireworks control laws, and ensure the safety and security of airports, harbors, and other facilities and institutions in the State against the discharge of illegal fireworks and explosives. Requires a report to the Legislature. Appropriates funds.

HB1042 RELATING TO THE PRACTICE OF BEHAVIOR ANALYSIS. EDN

Makes permanent the exemption from the behavior analyst licensing requirements for teachers working in collaboration with a licensed behavior analyst or licensed psychologist. EDN

Changes the Department of Education's quarterly report on autism spectrum disorder to an annual report.

#### HB1048 RELATING TO EDUCATION.

EDN, FIN

Establishes the Hawaii Educational Expenditure Trust Fund as a separate fund of the Department of Education for improving the education of, and supporting the programs benefiting, the students of the Hawaii public school system.

#### HB1049 RELATING TO INCOME TAX.

EDN, FIN

Adds new tax credit for teacher's expenses. Adds an inflation index for the income tax brackets, personal exemption amount and standard deduction amounts. Increases the amounts for the income tax brackets, personal exemption amount and standard deduction amounts for tax year 2023. Increases the adjusted gross income amounts for the qualification of low-income credits. Increases the amount of the credits that assist working families.

#### HB1050 RELATING TO GENERAL EXCISE TAX EXEMPTIONS.

TOU, WAL, FIN

Exempts certain groceries, feminine hygiene products, incontinence products, and over-the-counter drugs from the general excise tax.

Establishes within the Department of Land and Natural Resources the visitor green fee program to collect a fee from visitors through an environmental license and allocate the revenue to protect, restore, and manage natural and cultural resources. MENTAL HEALTH.

Allows the Department of Hawaiian Home Lands to assume historic preservation review of the effect of any proposed project for lands under its jurisdiction except for projects affecting properties listed or nominated for inclusion in the Hawaii register of historic places or the national register of historic places.

#### <u>HB1057</u> RELATING TO INTERIM ADMINISTRATIVE RULES OF

JHA

THE DEPARTMENT OF HAWAIIAN HOME LANDS. Allows the Department of Hawaiian Home Lands to issue interim rules that shall be exempt from the public notice, public hearing, and gubernatorial approval requirements of chapter 91, Hawaii Revised Statutes, after beneficiary consultation is conducted by the Department of Hawaiian Home Lands and upon approval by the Hawaiian Homes Commission. The interim rules shall be effective for not more than eighteen months.

#### HB1058 RELATING TO ADOPTION.

Allows an adopted individual to benefit both by relationship through a natural parent and through an adoptive parent in a disposition or other designation as provided for in accordance with the Hawaiian Homes Commission Act, 1920, as amended, or administrative rules. Allows the adopted individual and individual's natural family to continue having the same familial relationship.

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<u>HB1059</u> RELATING TO AFFORDABLE HOUSING ON HAWAIIAN HOME LANDS.

HSG, FIN

Makes permanent Act 141, Session Laws of Hawaii 2009, which requires the counties to issue affordable housing credits to the Department of Hawaiian Home Lands upon the department's request. Makes permanent Act 98, Session Laws of Hawaii 2012, which requires the counties to issue affordable housing credits for each residential unit developed by the Department of Hawaiian Home Lands.

<u>HB1060</u> RELATING TO SCHOOL IMPACT FEES.

Makes permanent Act 197, Session Laws of Hawaii 2021, which excludes housing developed by the Department of Hawaiian Home Lands from school impact fees.

Prohibits the department of health from requiring an applicant, operator, employee, or adult volunteer at a healthcare facility or, in the case of a healthcare facility operated in a private residence, any adult living in the home other than the client, to consent to fingerprinting except in connection with the initial licensing or certification of the individual or healthcare facility. In the case of a healthcare facility operated in a private residence, any adult living in the home other than the client, who was not living in the home at the time of initial licensing of certification, shall not be required to be fingerprinted more than once. Resets initial fingerprinting and background check requirements if the licensee terminates the license and later applies for a new license. Provides that the department of human services shall not require service providers who have direct contact with individuals receiving adult services to be fingerprinted as part of the criminal history record check process more than once.

### HB1309 RELATING TO CARE HOMES.

HLT/HUS, FIN

Requires all playgrounds located in state and county parks and on public school grounds include special needs recreational playground equipment as part of the recreational apparatuses by 6/30/2025 including at a minimum a wheelchair accessible swing set. HB1483 RELATING TO GENERAL EXCISE TAX. ECD, FIN Reduces and eliminates the general excise tax for the sale of groceries that are eligible under the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program or Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants, and Children over a four-year period. Reduces and eliminates the general excise tax for the sale of nonprescription drugs, medical supplies, and durable medical equipment over a four-year period.

Appropriates funds for three program specialist positions within the Executive Office on Aging for the State's Senior Medicare Patrol Program. RELATING TO RESPITE CARE. HLT, FIN HB1488 Requires the department of health to provide respite care, paid for by the State, to operators of certain care homes. HB1489 RELATING TO CARE HOMES. HLT/HUS, FIN Appropriates funds for back payments for each medicaid-eligible client cared for by certain care homes over the last fourteen years. HB1490 RELATING TO MEDICAID PATIENT CARE. HUS, FIN Appropriates funds to provide enhanced payments to type I adult residential care homes and developmental disabilities domiciliary homes that are caring for medicaid patients. RELATING TO INSPECTIONS. HB1491 HLT, CPC Requires the department of health to limit unannounced inspections to investigate complaints pertaining to client or patient abuse or life- or health-threatening danger at certain care facilities. Establishes requirements for complaints. Requires relicensing inspections to be scheduled.

HB1496 CAI, FIN Requires the State Art Museum to provide opportunities for the counties and private organizations located in Hawaii to display art through loan arrangements with the State Foundation on Culture and the Arts under the Arts in Public Places Program. Provides that artists who reside in Hawaii receive selection preference for the Arts in Public Places Program. Requires a report to the Legislature. HB1497 RELATING TO CONSUMER DATA PROTECTION. HET, CPC, FIN Establishes a framework to regulate controllers and processors with access to personal consumer data. Establishes that a violation of the consumer data privacy act constitutes an unfair method of competition and unfair and deceptive acts or practices in the conduct of any trade of commerce. Authorizes a person

injured by a violation of the personal consumer data act to bring

a civil action against a controller or processor.

HB1498 RELATING TO TAXATION.

EEP, ECD, FIN

Establishes a carbon emissions tax credit. Expands the environmental response, energy, and food security tax to include carbon emissions. Applies to taxable years beginning after 12/31/2023.

HB1499 RELATING TO COMMON-INTEREST DEVELOPMENTS.

CPC

Establishes the common-interest development oversight task force to examine the feasibility of bringing the various common-interest developments in the State under the oversight of the department of commerce and consumer affairs.

HB1500 RELATING TO CONDOMINIUMS.

CPC, FIN

Authorizes boards to borrow money for extraordinary expenses in the condominium event of an emergency situation and promptly disclose to owners the amount and purpose. Requires certain information to be included in budget summaries regarding estimated replacement reserves contributions.

<u>HB1501</u> RELATING TO CONDOMINIUM ASSOCIATIONS.

HSG, CPC, FIN

Establishes an ombudsman's office for condominium associations within the department of commerce and consumer affairs. Establishes an ombudsman's office special fund. Requires condominium association board members to meet certain educational requirements through classes offered by the ombudsman. Updates the Condominium Property Act to integrate the role and functions of the ombudsman's office for condominium associations. Appropriates funds for establishment of the ombudsman's office. Effective 1/1/2024.

HB1502 RELATING TO EVIDENCE.

JHA

Limits compelled disclosure of sources or unpublished information for journalists, newscasters, and persons participating in collection or dissemination of news or information of substantial public interest. Establishes exceptions.

### <u>HB1503</u> RELATING TO MENTAL HEALTH.

HLT/JHA, FIN

Requires the Department of Health to respond to reports about persons having severe mental illness and in need of assistance and to assess whether those persons may fulfill the criteria for assisted community treatment. Requires the Department of Health to track and publicly report certain data relating to crisis reports, emergency mental health transports, and court-ordered treatments. Appropriates moneys to the Department of Health for software and data collection and publication. ## <u>HB1505</u> RELATING TO THE HAWAII EMPLOYER-UNION HEALTH EEP, FIN BENEFITS TRUST FUND.

Encourages the EUTF to consider investment opportunities in industries that will sustain Hawaii's natural environment or produce economic opportunities for its residents, including renewable energy businesses and businesses that use investment capital to acquire the infrastructure and services needed to become energy sustainable. Appropriates funds to the EUTF.

### HB1506 RELATING TO THE EMPLOYEES' RETIREMENT SYSTEM EEP, FIN OF THE STATE OF HAWAII.

Requires the employees' retirement system, in evaluating venture capital investments, to consider opportunities in industries that will sustain Hawaii's natural environment or produce economic opportunities for its residents, including renewable energy businesses and businesses that use the investment capital to acquire the infrastructure and services needed to become energy sustainable. If the employees' retirement system board of trustees determines that it is not prudent to invest in any Hawaii venture capital meeting this description, requires the board to report the rationale for the decision in its annual report to the legislature. Appropriates funds to the Hawaii targeted investment program.

Requires the State of Hawaii Plant and Animal Declaration Form to be distributed, completed, and transmitted electronically.

HB581 RELATING TO CHILD CUSTODY.

Requires certain individuals attempting to serve as child custody evaluators to complete a training course on the dynamics of domestic violence every three years. Requires individuals to submit a letter or certificate of completion to the Family Court.
