The undersigned Maunakea Observatories' directors appreciate the opportunity to submit our testimony in **strong support** of Richard Matsuda's confirmation to the Mauna Kea Stewardship and Oversight Authority ("MKSOA"), for a term to expire June 30, 2025. Rich Matsuda was unanimously put forth by the Maunakea Observatories directors as the right representative to fill the Maunakea Observatories' designated seat on the governing board.

The Maunakea Observatories appreciate the legislature's efforts to create the Mauna Kea Stewardship and Oversight Authority through the passing of HB 2024 last session and now through the confirmation process for MKSOA board members.
