Testimony of DAWN N. S. CHANG Chairperson

Before the Senate Committee on HAWAIIAN AFFAIRS

In consideration of GOVERNOR'S MESSAGE 565 SUBMITTING FOR THE CONSIDERATION AND CONFIRMATION TO THE ISLAND BURIAL COUNCIL, ISLANDS OF MAUI AND LĀNA'I, GUBERNATORIAL NOMINEE, MICHELE HO'OPI'I FOR A TERM TO EXPIRE 6/30/2025.

The Department of Land and Natural Resources (Department) supports Governor's Message 565, nominating Ms. Michele Ho'opi'i to the Island Burial Council, Islands of Maui Lāna'i expiring June 30, 2025.

The Island Burial Councils are established under Section 6E-43.5, Hawai'i Revised Statutes. The Councils determine whether to preserve in place or relocate previously identified native Hawaiian burials site, recognize lineal and cultural descendants, and provide counsel and advise to the Department. With the exception of the Moloka'i Island Burial Council, the island burial councils consist of no more than nine members, of which six representatives shall represent a specific geographic area, and no more than three shall be representatives of development and large landowner interests. Ms. Ho'opi'i is seeking to represent the Wailuku geographic area.

Ms. Ho'opi'i currently lives in Waiehu, within the moku of Wailuku, that geographic area of which she is seeking to represent. Both of her parents are of Native Hawaiian blood, her father with familial and historical ties to Kahakuloa and mother with familial and historical ties to Waiehu. In fact, Ms. Ho'opi'i spends her evenings and weekends tending to her mother's family lo'i kalo in Waiehu.

She is a graduate of Baldwin High School, the Maui Community College, and the University of Phoenix. She has been an employee of Hawaiian Electric Company since 2006 as an Information Technology Desktop Specialist and in 2019, she became an Asset Data Operation Analyst. Her responsibilities include
