SUBJECT: HB1263 HD2 RELATING TO THE HAWAII ABLE SAVINGS PROGRAM

The Hawaii State Council on Developmental Disabilities **STRONGLY SUPPORTS HB1263 HD2**, which authorizes the Director of Finance to use funds deposited into the Hawaiii ABLE savings program trust fund for any expenses incurred in developing and administering the Hawaiii ABLE savings program. Establishes a position within the state council on developmental disabilities of the department of health to support the Hawaiii ABLE savings program. Appropriates funds.

Act 206 of Hawaii Session Laws of 2015 enacted the Hawaiii ABLE Savings Program. The ABLE Savings Program is modeled after 529 (Section 529 of the Internal Revenue Code) college savings plans, where interest earned on savings will be tax-free. It allows individuals with disabilities the same types of flexible savings account that people without disabilities have, such as college savings accounts, health savings accounts, and individual retirement accounts. Furthermore, an ABLE account would enable individuals with a disability to accrue funds to pay for a variety of expenses, such as medical and dental care, education, community-based supports, employment training, assistive technology, housing, and transportation.

There are approximately 23,000 individuals with developmental disabilities in the State of Hawaii who are eligible to open an ABLE Savings Program and an estimate of another 20,000 individuals with other disabilities who are eligible for an ABLE Savings Program. However, we currently have less than 75 individuals enrolled in the Hawaii ABLE Savings Program. Throughout the past two years, the Council has been providing outreach to promote the Hawaii ABLE Savings program. We have learned many agencies, families and eligible individuals have been misinformed about ABLE Accounts, "it sounds too good to be true, what's the catch" is what we often hear. For years, they have been told do not allow your savings to go above \$2,000 or you will lose your state and federal funding supports. In addition, the only way to sign up for an ABLE account is online. Many individuals do not feel comfortable providing their personal information online. The Council will spend time with a qualified individual or their family member to explain the process and then additional time to walk them through the process of signing up online.

The \$100,000 in a special fund is to be used in case of an audit. These funds would not need to be recurring, it would be a onetime fund. The full-time staff position would be devoted to statewide outreach, advocacy, and relationship management for the Hawaii ABLE savings program, the program we will grow. Growing the use of these accounts also requires continued

education for a population that has been told for decades that if they worked or saved any money they would lose everything; their home, their income, their services, and their supports. This job position is undoing decades of misinformation for our most vulnerable population who we are trying to re-educate and get into our workforce. The funding for this position would come from the general fund and would be recurring.

- EOA's Position: The Executive Office on Aging (EOA), an attached agency to the Department
- of Health, **supports HB1263 HD2**, relating to the Hawai'i ABLE Savings Program.
- 3 **Fiscal Implications:** This measure appropriates funds for fiscal year 2023-2024 to be deposited
- 4 into the Hawai'i ABLE Savings Program trust fund and establishes one full-time equivalent (1.0
- 5 FTE) permanent position within the State Council on Developmental Disabilities (DD Council).
- 6 **Purpose and Justification:** The purpose of this bill is to authorize the Director of the Budget
- and Finance to administer funds deposited into the Hawai'i ABLE Savings Program Trust Fund,
- 8 establishes a full-time equivalent (1.00 FTE) permanent position within DD Council to provide
- 9 statewide outreach, advocacy, and relationship management for the Hawai'i ABLE Savings
- Program, and appropriates funds to be deposited into the Hawai'i ABLE Savings Program Trust
- Fund. The Hawai'i ABLE Savings Program allows individuals with disabilities the same types of
- 12 flexible savings account that people without disabilities have, such as college savings accounts,

- health savings accounts, and individual retirement accounts. Additionally, an ABLE account
- 2 would enable individuals with a disability to accrue funds to pay for a variety of expenses, such
- 3 as medical and dental care, education, community-based supports, employment training, assistive

- By supporting the program with one (1.0) FTE position, DD Council will be able to
- 6 provide the necessary outreach and education about the program and its benefits to the
- 7 approximately **23,000** individuals with developmental disabilities in Hawai'i to be able to save
- 8 money for their futures.
- 9 **Recommendation:** EOA strongly supports this measure provided that its enactment does not
- 10 reduce or replace priorities with the Administration's budget request.

RELATING TO THE HAWAII ABLE SAVINGS PROGRAM

The Department of Budget and Finance (B&F) offers comments on this bill.

House Bill No. 1263, H.D. 2: 1) amends Section 256B-8, HRS, to authorize the Director of Finance to use funds from the Hawai'i ABLE Savings Program Trust Fund (HASPTF) for expenses incurred in developing and administering the Hawai'i ABLE Savings Program (HASP); 2) establishes 1.00 Program Specialist IV position within the State Council on Developmental Disabilities attached to the Department of Health (DOH) to provide outreach, advocacy, and relationship management for HASP; and 3) appropriates an undetermined amount of general funds in FY 24 to be deposited into the HASPTF.

Regarding Section 1 of the bill, B&F has no objections; however, it should be noted that the HASPTF's annual revenues have been and are expected to continue to be \$0 a year. Even if the HASPTF managed to generate interest on contributor deposits, the interest earnings would be minimal due to limited participation in the HASP.

Regarding Section 2 of the bill, it is unclear what funding source would be utilized for the position. B&F defers to DOH on their available resources to fund the position.

Regarding Section 3 of the bill, B&F has no objections to a small cash infusion to provide funding for any potential future needs for auditing services or other administrative costs.
