The Office of the Governor **SUPPORTS** H.B. No. 1371, HD1, Relating to the Sand Island State Recreation Area.

Encompassing roughly 141 acres, the Sand Island State Recreation Area is an underutilized park that has the potential to become a recreational area, with expanded facilities and activities for the people of O'ahu and the State to enjoy.

The Office of the Governor is especially supportive of the section of this bill that proposes to create a Native Hawaiian arts and cultural center, which would help to serve the needs of the Native Hawaiian arts community. With the opportunity to create economic opportunities for Native Hawaiian artists and practitioners, the proposed cultural center could include canoe sheds and storage areas to house the canoes, paddles, life vests, and necessary equipment for the canoe clubs at Ke'ehi; a large open stadium facility for concerts and cultural events; classroom spaces; an art studio; outside facilities for carving and other cultural practices; and a potential commercial kitchen for the teaching of traditional food preparation, and a garden for growing traditional foods and other traditional practices.

RELATING TO THE SAND ISLAND STATE RECREATION AREA

House Bill 1371, House Draft 1 proposes to appropriate funds to the Department of Land and Natural Resources (Department) to prepare a master plan for the Sand Island State Recreation Area. **The Department supports this measure provided that its passage does not replace or adversely impact priorities indicated in the Executive Budget request, and offers one amendment.**

The Department appreciates the Legislature's recognition that Sand Island State Recreation Area is an underutilized park with aging infrastructure, facilities and undeveloped sections. In recent years we have applied prior legislative appropriations to target some areas, including sewer system upgrades, redevelopment of the softball field complex and associated facilities, and a large-scale shoreline debris remediation has been initiated. These projects have tackled issues within the developed area of the park, but the undeveloped section holds great potential for expanded facilities and activities as envisioned by this bill. The Legislature should be aware that a variety of temporary uses, including support for the city's adjacent Sand Island wastewater treatment plan upgrades are ongoing as well, and will also enhance and prepare park areas for future improvements.

The Department would like to point out that page 6 line 21 through page 7 line 11 of the bill refers to Ke'ehi Lagoon Beach Park, a City & County of Honolulu Park and requests that it be removed or clarified in an amended version.

The Department appreciates the consideration of an appropriation in the amount of \$500,000 as noted in the Standing Committee Report 434 for the proposed planning and necessary entitlements. The Department also looks forward to working collaboratively with community partners and Hawaiian cultural groups and practitioners interested in stewardship and revitalization of Sand Island State Recreation Area.

I am Vicky Holt Takamine, the Executive Director of PA'I Foundation and the kumu hula of Pua Ali'i 'Ilima. I am submitting testimony in Strong Support of HB1371 HD1 on behalf of the PA'I Foundation, a 501 c 3 non profit organization based in Kapālama, O'ahu. The mission of PA'I is to preserve and perpetuate Native Hawaiian cultural traditions and practices for future generations. We do this by creating spaces and opportunities for artists and cultural practitioners to share, demonstrate, display and practice their arts and culture.

Currently located in the 'ahupua'a of Kapālama, O'ahu, PA'I will be opening the PA'I Art & Cultural Center in Kaka'ako in the Fall of 2023. The 5,000 sq ft space will have a 3,000 sq ft performing arts space, an Arts Cafe and 1,000 sq ft meeting and training center for artists & cultural practitioners. While the center will be able to support the performing arts community and a limited number of other types of cultural practices, it is insufficient to serve the broader needs of the carving, fishing, lua (martial arts), canoe paddling, ocean activities and other Native Hawaiian events and cultural practices that need a lot of open space and/or access to the ocean. We believe that the currently undeveloped areas in this location may be a perfect location for a Native Hawaiian Cultural Center to serve the needs of this underserved community.

Once a thriving fishing village, the Ke'ehi Lagoon Beach Park and Sand Island State Recreation Area is now the home to the Hokule'a and 16 local and high school canoe clubs. The canoe clubs, located in the Ke'ehi Lagoon Beach Park serve nearly 2400 adults and youth annually year-round for after school and weekend activities. The Hawai'i Softball Foundation has done an incredible job of activating and maintaing the softball complex in the Sand Island State Recreation Area.

A comprehensive master plan to serve the needs of all users and adress aging infrastructures and facilities for this area will help to guide the State of Hawai'i Department of Land and Natural Resources, Harbors Division and all stake holders with guidance for improvements and development. In order help with these efforts, PA'I has submitted a grant request for \$100,000 to the National Endowment for the Arts for community outreach and design charette. We will advise if we get awarded any funding for this project.

Dear Chairperson Yamashita and Kitagawa and the House of Representatives
Members of the Community of Finance:

Aloha name is Kēhaulani Kupihea I am the founder and Executive Director of Mauiola Ke'ehi a Hawaiian non-profit organization based in the proposed location of Ke'ehi, Mauiola or also called (sand island) Our non-profit is a Hawaiian culture-focused, place-based education organization steeped in a rich history that provides transformative healing through culture and art. I have fished and paddled canoe here for over 40 years it is vital that we continue to perpetuate and uplift our ancestral ways of knowing. Our ohana is genealogically tied to the tidal islands of this Wahi Pana.

Hundreds of such villages thrived in pre-Western contact Hawai'i. The fishponds of the area once provided the Native Hawaiian population with a sustainable source of protein, none of the 41 fishponds are left in the Honolulu area. Ke'ehi is the home to the sacred tidal islands, Kahaka'aulana, Mokuoeo and Mokauea, whose rich cultural history includes the summer residences of **King Kalākaua, David Malo Kupihea** who was the last konohiki of the area, royal fishing & limu grounds, an area for teaching navigation, shark riders, and more.

We have led collaborative educational efforts several days a week with multiple community organizations and schools since 2010. Mauiola Ke'ehi currently partners with approximately 14 public and private schools, all of the University of Hawai'i colleges and over 50 different community groups. On an average year, Mauiola Ke'ehi engages approximately 1,500-2,000 people from the community, at least half of whom are Native Hawaiian and half who come from underserved communities afflicted by historical trauma and characterized by low-income status, low educational attainment, and minority ethnicity. While the program serves students of all ages, educators at all levels, and community members, the target population are kanaka maoli and kama'āina and at-risk populations, such as those recovering from substance use and returning to society from prison. It is vital for our community to have a space of healing.


Aloha:
