In consideration of HOUSE BILL 562, HOUSE DRAFT 1 RELATING TO PERMITS

House Bill 562, House Draft 1 (HB 562 HD1) proposes to establish an exemption from applicable county permit requirements for repetitive construction projects for facilities under the control of the Department of Education, University of Hawai'i, or School Facilities Authority. The Department of Land and Natural Resources (Department) acknowledges the intent of this measure and offers the following comments.

The Department appreciates the House Committee on Water and Land's (WAL) recognition of our concerns with the exemptions from applicable county permit requirements for repetitive construction projects for facilities under the control of the Department of Education, University of Hawaii, or School Facilities Authority and its potential unintended impact on the State's continued participation in the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP).

The Department recommends the amendments added by WAL to HB 562 HD1, Page 1, lines 10-14, which reads "provided that no contract for repetitive construction projects shall be exempt from federal, state, or county floodplain management development standards or statutes, codes, ordinances, rules, or regulations with which compliance is required under the National Flood Insurance Program" be retained to protect the State of Hawai'i's participation in this valuable Federal program aimed to protect life and property from flooding.
