Chair Dela Cruz, Vice-Chair Keith-Agaran, and Members of the Committee:

The Department of Taxation ("Department") offers the following <u>comments</u> regarding H.B. 612, H.D. 2, S.D. 1, for your consideration.

H.B. 612, H.D. 2, S.D. 1, adds a new section to chapter 235, Hawaii Revised Statutes (HRS), to create a nonrefundable income tax credit equal to 15 percent of net farm income for eligible farmers with less than \$250,000 in net farm income or 10 percent of net farm income for taxpayers with net farm income greater than \$250,000 but less than \$1,000,000. The term "eligible farmer" is defined as a taxpayer who provides proof of at least two-thirds of excess federal gross income from farming or ranching, as shown by federal Form 1040 Schedule F or from fishing, as shown by federal Form 1040 Schedule C. The bill has a defective effective date of June 30, 3000 and applies to taxable years beginning after December 31, 2023.

The Department appreciates the Senate Committee on Agriculture and Environment's amendments to the measure, which removed the "qualified expenses" language and provide the Department time for implementation.

The Department suggests additional amendments to the measure as follows:

First, the Department notes that subsection (b) is ambiguous as to whether the amount of the tax credit is equal to a percentage of "tax liability," as indicated on page 2, line 11, or a percentage of "net farm income," as indicated on page 2, lines 13 and line 17. If the intent of the bill is for the amount of the tax credit to be based on a percentage of "net farm income," the Department suggests deleting "tax liability based on" from line 11 of page 2 so that subsection 2 reads as follows:

(b) The amount of the tax credit shall be equal to a percentage of the eligible farmer's net farm income as follows:

Second, the Department suggests that subsection (e), which applies to refundable credits, be deleted to avoid ambiguity.

The Department estimates a revenue loss to the general fund as follows (\$ millions):

Finally, the Department notes that it can implement this bill, with the amendments noted above, for taxable years beginning after December 31, 2023.

SUBJECT: INCOME, Farming Income Tax Credit

BILL NUMBER: HB 612 SD 1

INTRODUCED BY: Senate Committee on Agriculture and Environment

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY: Creates an income tax credit to alleviate the high costs of production for farmers, ranchers, and fishers and incentivize growth in the agricultural sector in the State.

SYNOPSIS: Adds a new section to chapter 235, HRS, to establish the farming income tax credit.

All claims for the tax credit, including amended claims, shall be filed on or before the end of the twelfth month following the close of the taxable year for which the credit may be claimed. Failure to comply with the foregoing provision shall constitute a waiver of the right to claim the credit.

Defines the following terms:

"Eligible farmer" means a taxpayer that provides proof of at least two-thirds of excess federal gross income from farming or ranching, as shown by federal Form 1040 Schedule F filings, or from fishing, as shown by federal Form 1040 Schedule C filings.

"Excess federal gross income" means the amount of federal gross income from all sources for the tax year."

EFFECTIVE DATE: June 30, 3000; applicable to taxable years beginning after December 31, 2023.

STAFF COMMENTS: As with any other targeted tax credit, this measure picks winners and losers in the marketplace. The winners are the qualified taxpayers, and the losers are the rest of us who need to pay for the cost of government and make up for the winners.

These, along with numerous other proposals targeted at specific types of business activity, are truly an indictment of what everyone has known and acknowledged since before Hawaii became a state, that is, the climate imposed by government regulations and taxation makes it difficult to survive without some kind of subsidy such as tax credits from government. Once those subsidies disappear, so will the businesses. Instead of throwing out such breaks for special interests, lawmakers must endeavor to make Hawaii's business climate more welcoming and conducive to nurturing entrepreneurs.

The bill also has two confusing definitions.

Re: HB 612 SD1

Page 2

First, it defines "excess federal gross income" as federal gross income from all sources for the tax year. The term "excess," however, connotes an amount by which a particular variable exceeds another amount, and no such other amount is specified in the definition.

Second, it defines "eligible farmer" as a taxpayer "that provides proof of at least two-thirds of excess federal gross income from farming or ranching ... or from fishing" as shown on federal tax return forms. Does that mean it is sufficient if an eligible farmer receives two-thirds of its federal gross income from all sources from farming, ranching, or fishing, as reported on the federal return, or is the farmer not going to be eligible unless it proves the amounts on the return by other documentation?

If this bill is to move forward, we suggest that those two definitions be replaced by one definition:

"Eligible farmer" means a taxpayer at least two-thirds of whose gross income from all sources is properly reported as gross income from farming or ranching on federal Form 1040 Schedule F, or from fishing on federal Form 1040 Schedule C.

We have continued vegetable production and are now full time farmers. We have a CSA, sell some products on a food hub, and do a weekly farmer; smarket. We can do this as we have a small pension to help with the bills and we have health care through our former employer. Younger farmers would have a harder time to get started to cover their expenses. Selling fresh produce has very low margins even selling at retail prices. Trying to make a living selling bunches of green onions or beets at \$3 is not the road to quick riches. Produce also has a short shelf life so it is high risk for loss. But it is satisfying to feed our community with healthy fresh food. Helping with a tax credit can assist a little bit with keeping those small profits as income. Limits on the credits for larger established farms that have high volume would be acceptable if \$ for the State are an issue. I think truly helping small farms be competative would behelpful especially for younger farmers trying to start up. We hope our kids will see the value in growing and earning from this 'aina and will take over some day.
