SUBJECT: H.B. 739 HD1 - Relating To Motor Vehicle Safety Inspections HEARING: Thursday, February 16, 2023, 2:00 p.m.

The City and County of Honolulu, Department of Customer Services (CSD) supports this bill with amendments.

Pursuant to Section 6-402 of the Revised Charter of the City and County of Honolulu, CSD administers the motor vehicle registration program for the island of Oahu.

While CSD supports the intent of the bill, CSD respectfully requests that the Committee amend the bill as follows: (1) the bill be limited to only those situations where both the motor vehicle's registration and safety check are expired and (2) the owner of the motor vehicle be allowed to first register the vehicle without a safety inspection certificate, then upon the registration of the vehicle, a safety inspection certificate may be obtained.

On the rare occasion where the motor vehicle's registration and safety inspection certification are both expired, the priority should be the registration of the motor vehicle.

On Oahu, the motor vehicle registration fee generates is several hundred dollars¹ which is deposited in the City's highway fund. This fund is used among other things to (1) design, construct, and repair public roads, highways, and bikeways; (2) installation, maintenance, and repairs of street lights; design, construction, and (3) preservation of safety on our roadways.
