Thank you for the opportunity to testify on this bill.¹ The Campaign Spending Commission ("Commission") supports this bill.

This bill amends Hawaii Revised Statutes ("HRS") §11-351(b) to limit to \$100 in the aggregate, the amount of cash a candidate, candidate committee, or noncandidate committee may accept as a contribution from a single person during an election period. This is similar to the limitation placed on anonymous cash contribution under HRS §11-353(d). In the amounts usually involved in political contributions, cash is difficult to trace. This bill would make violations of certain campaign finance law violations easier to detect and thus prevent.

The Commission requests that this committee pass this bill.
